**ब्रह्मवृक्ष** a. grown by devotion.  
**ब्रह्मवेद** m. the Veda of the Brahmans or the Veda of sacred spells, the Atharvaveda.  
**ब्रह्मवेदिन्** a. = ब्रह्मविद्.  
**ब्रह्मवैवर्ते** & **०क** n. T. of a Purāna.  
**ब्रह्मव्रत** n. a cert. religious observance; the vow of chastity, **०धर** a. performing it.  
**ब्रह्मशास्त्रा** f. Brahman's hall.  
**ब्रह्मशिरस्** & **०शीर्षेन्** n. Brahman's head, N. of a mythical weapon.  
**ब्रह्मसंश्रित** a. sharpened by devotion or prayers.  
**ब्रह्मसंसद्** f. Brahman's hall or an assembly of Brahmans.  
**ब्रह्मसंख्य** a. wholly devoted to sacred knowledge.  
**ब्रह्मसत्त्वं** n. the sacrifice of devotion or prayer, adj. **०न्निन्**.  
**ब्रह्मसदन** & **०सदस्** n. Brahman's seat or hall.  
**ब्रह्मसरस्** n. Brahman's lake, N. of a holy bathing-place.  
**ब्रह्मसर्व** m. gush of prayer, N. of a cert. libation.  
**ब्रह्मसाष्टिता** f. equality or union with Brahman.  
**ब्रह्मसिद्धान्त** m. T. of sev. works.  
**ब्रह्मसुवर्चला** f. a cert. plant, also an infusion or a decoction of it.  
**ब्रह्मसूत्र** n. the Brahmanical thread worn over the shoulder; a theological or philosophical Sūtra work, esp. that of Bādarāyana on the Vedānta philosophy.  
**ब्रह्मस्तेन** m. a stealer of holy things, esp. who gets possessed of the Veda by illicit means.  
**ब्रह्मस्तेय** n. abstr. to prec.  
**ब्रह्मस्थल** n. N. of a town.  
**ब्रह्मस्व** n. the property of Brahmans.  
**ब्रह्महत्या** f. killing of a Brahman.  
**ब्रह्महृन्** m. the murderer of a Brahman.  
**ब्रह्माङ्गलि** m. joining the hands for the sake of (or while studying) the Veda; **०कृत** a. performing it.  
**ब्रह्माणी** f. Brahman's wife, E. of Durgā.  
**ब्रह्माण्ड** n. Brahman's egg, i.e. the Universe.  
**1 ब्रह्माश** a. to be eaten by Brahmans.  
**2 ब्रह्माश** a. beginning with Brahman.  
**ब्रह्माधिनमिक** a. relating to the sacred study.  
**ब्रह्माभ्यास** m. the study of the Veda.  
**ब्रह्मारण्य** n. N. of a forest.  
**ब्रह्मारम्भ** m. beginning of the sacred study.  
**ब्रह्मार्थ** a. worthy of Brahman or of sacred knowledge.  
**ब्रह्मावर्ते** m. the holy land (between Sarasvatī and Dṛṣadvatī).  
**ब्रह्मास्त्र** n. Brahman's weapon (myth.).  
**ब्रह्माकृति** f. sacrifice of prayer or devotion.  
**ब्रह्मिष्ठ** (superl.), **ब्रह्मीचंस** (compar.) a most holy or a holier Brahman.  
**ब्रह्मिष्ठ** a. kindled with prayers.  
**ब्रह्मोञ्ज** a. having neglected or forgotten the Veda, abstr. **०ता** f.  
**ब्रह्मोवा** a. forming the conversation among Brahmans, w. **कथा** f. discussions about or riddles from the Veda; n. rivalry in sacred knowledge.  
**ब्रह्मोपनिषद्** f. T. of an Upanishad.  
**ब्रह्मोदक** n. boiled rice for Brahmans.  
**ब्राह्मी** f. ई pertaining to (the) Brahman i.e. divine, holy, spiritual; or pert. to Brahmans i.e. belonging or favourable to, consisting of the sacerdotal class, Brahmanical. — f. ई E. of Durgā or Sarasvatī; a woman married according to the Brahman rite.  
**1 ब्राह्मण** m. a priest or theologian, a Brahman; f. ई a woman of the priestly caste.  
**2 ब्राह्मण** f. ई Brahmanical; n. the Brahman or Absolute, sacred or divine power, a cert. class of Vedic writings.  
**ब्राह्मणक** m. a bad Brahman, a Brahman only by name.
