अपोह्य Tatpur. m. f. n. (-ह्य:-ह्या-ह्यम्) To be removed, to be taken away. E. जह with अप, kritya aff. यत.

अपीगण्ड Tatpur. m. f. n. (-ण्ड:-ण्डा-ण्डम्) The same as अपोगण्ड II. q. v. E. अ neg. and पौगण्ड.

स्पोत्ष Tatpur. 1. m. f. n. (-ष:-षा-षम्) ¹Unmanly, impotent. ²Cowardly.

2. n. (-षम्) ¹ Unmanliness. ² Cowardice. E. স্থ neg. and पौर्ष.

यपौर्षेय Tatpur. m. f. n. (-य:-यी-यम्) Not being of human origin, not made by men, of divine origin, as the Veda; e. g. अपौर्षेयो वेदः; or in the Sánkhya-tattwa-kaumudi: श्रुतिवास्त्रज्ञनितं वास्त्रार्थज्ञानं तच्च स्वतः प्रमाणम-पौर्षेयवेदजनितलेन सकलदोषशङ्काविनिमुक्तेर्युक्तम्; or in the Jaim.-nyáyam.: जहयन्थो ८पौर्षेयः पौर्षेयो ८थवा-यम: &c. E. अ neg. and पौर्षेयः

अपीक्षेयल n. (-लम्) The not being made by men, the having a divine origin; e. g. in the Sánkhya Sútras: न चि-भिर्पोक्षेयलाद्दिस तद्रथसातीन्द्रियलात्; or नापोक्षेय-लाजिसलमङ्रादिनतः हः अपीक्षेय, taddh. aff. ल.

लानित्यलमङ्गरादिवत. E. अपोषधेय, taddh. aff. ल. अप्हात्स्त्रसमाधि Karmadh. f. (-धि:) A fanciful name of a Buddhistic samádhi or profound meditation. (Burnouf renders it in the Lotus de la bonne loi: 'meditation which removes all water', but believes that the more correct reading of this word is असकत्समाधि; perhaps it may mean: 'a meditation completed by means of water'.) E. अप्-क्रत्न and समाधि.

त्राचर Tatpur. m. (-र:) An aquatic animal; (a reading of doubtful correctness in Loiseleur Deslongchamps' ed. of Manu 7. 72.; the other editions and the Mss. of the E. I. H. read instead of it, सूप्र). E. सूप् and चर.

স্থাম m.f.n. (-ম:-মা-সম্) (ved.) Obtained, acquired, reached (Sáyańa: স্থানাম মৃত্যু মিন্নামম). E. স্থাম্ (a radical become obsolete as far as the verbal inflection is concerned, where it is represented in the classical Sanskrit by স্থাম্, i. e. স্থাম্, pref. স্থা), krit aff. क्र.

अप्तस् n. (-प्रः) A sacrificial act; (Unnadik.: त्राप्तो यज्ञ-

कर्मणि, where it is not a various reading of अपस्, आपस् or अप्तस् qq. vv.). E. आप् with आ shortened (acc. to the native etym., but more correctly अप, comp. the Etym. of अप्त), un. aff. अस्न, ágama तुट.

স্থাস m. (-মু:) (ved.) 1 Soma. 2 A sacrificial animal. 3 Body. A desired object, or object of desire (perhaps more correctly: attainment, scil. of a desired object). 5 Possessing, comprising. [The two first meanings are two various interpretations of the word in Vájas. 5. 35. or Śatap. III. 6. 3. 8.: जुषाणी अपूराज्यस्य वेतु (quoted also by the Kášiká on Páń. VI. 1. 118.), viz. Sáyańa: अप्न: सूद्धारूप: सोम:, or Mahídh.: ग्रप्तश्चाच सोमः । ग्राप्तीति पीतः सञ्क्रीरम् i. e. 'Soma, because it comes into the body'; and Nrisinha in the Swaramanjari: त्रप्रयिद्धिय: पशु: (probably as connected with ग्रम्स); the third meaning is that given by Bhattojid. on the Un. (perhaps because body is pervaded by Soma); the fourth meaning results from Bhattoj.'s Praudham. but belongs apparently to the word only in अप्रोधाम q. v. where it would have also the fifth meaning, according to a passage from the Satap. quoted s. v. अप्रोद्याम; in either of the last two meanings अप्रो: represents probably the abl. of the abstract noun in -3 which in the Vedas often assumes the function of our infinitive, expressed in the classical idiom by the accus. -तुम, अप्रोस being thus equal in value to the classical आप्तम्.] E. आप with shortened न्ना (accord. to the native etym., but more correctly न्नप, comp. the etym. of अप्त), un. aff. तु.

त्राप्त Tatpur. m. (-मू:) (ved.) ¹ Sending water (i. e. rain), an epithet of Indra, Agni &c. ² Quick as water (i. e. as the falling rain), an epithet of the horses of the Aswins. E. ऋष् and तुर.

अपूर्य Tatpur. n. (-धेम्) (ved.) The being a sender of, or the sending of, water (i.e. of rain); said of Indra and Agni. E. अप and तुर्ये.

अप्रोचीम Tatpur. m. (-म:) (ved.) ¹The name of a sacrifice, viz. of the seventh or last part (somasansthá) of the Jyotishtoma; (Mádhava in enumerating the seven parts of the Jyotishtoma, in his Jaiminiyanyayam., — accord. to all the Mss. of this work within my reach — makes it, the sixth part of the latter, but he is at variance in this respect with the older authorities of the Kalpasútras and of Kumárila's Várttikas); it is not nitya or obligatory for the performance of this sacrifice, like the Agnishtoma (q. v.), but kámya or voluntary, and instituted merely for the attainment of a specific desire. See ज्योतिष्टोम. 2 The name of a Sámavedaverse, becauses it closes the ceremonies connected with the sacrifice of this name. E. त्रप्रोस (abl. of त्रप्त) and याम.
