

rājya, *n.* kingship. [rāj, 1211.]

rātī, *a.* ready to give or bless; gracious; as *f.* grace. [v̄l rā, 'give!']
rātra, *n.* for rātri at end of cpds. [1315b.]
rātri, later rātri, *f.* night. [perhaps fr. v̄ram, 'rest?']

v̄ rādh (rādhnōti; rādhyate [761a], -ti; rāradha; rātsit; rātsyati; rāddhā; rāddhvā; -rādhyā; rādhāyati). —1. be successful; prosper, have luck; be happy, 1037; —2. trans. make successful or happy; gratify; —caus. accomplish; make happy, satisfy. [akin w. v̄rdh.]
+ a pa, —1. hit away (from the mark), miss (the mark), fail; —2. be at fault, be to blame; offend, sin; aparādha, guilty, to blame, 331. [for 1, cf. the simple verb, 'succeed,' i.e. 'make a hit'; for 2, cf. the relation of Eng. *fail* and *fault*.]

+ ā, caus. make happy, satisfy.

rādhās, *n.* gracious gift, blessing. [v̄rādh, 'gratify': for mg, cf. French *gratification*, 'gift.]

rāmā, *a.* dark; as *m.* Rāma, hero of the epos Rāmāyana; cf. rāghava.

rāyas-poṣa, *m.* development, i.e. increase of wealth. [gen. s. of rāi, 1250d: 1712.]

rāva, *m.* cry; yell; howl. [v̄ru, 1148.2.]

rāgi, *m.* troop, host; heap. [perhaps akin w. rāqmī, q.v.: for connection of mg, cf. Eng. *line* and French *cordon*, as applied to soldiers.]

rāstrā, *n.* kingdom; sovereignty. [v̄raj 1: see 219⁵, 1185a.]

rāṣṭrī, *f.* directrix, sovereign. [v̄raj 1: see 219⁵, 1182².]

rāṣṭriyā, *a.* belonging to the sovereignty; as *m.* sovereign, ruler. [rāṣṭra, 1215.]

rāhū, *m.* The Seizer, Rāhu, who is supposed to seize and swallow sun and moon, and thus cause eclipses. [prob. fr. v̄rabh, 1178².]

v̄ ri or rī (rīnākti; rīyate [761c]). —1. *act.* cause to run or stream, let loose; —2. *mid.* flow; run; dissolve. [cf. Lat. rī-vus, 'stream, brook'; provincial Eng. *run*, 'brook,' as in *Bull Run*; Ger. *rinnen*, Eng. *run*: see also v̄li + pra.]

v̄ rīe (rīnākti; rīcyate [761b]; rīréca, rīricé; áráikṣit, árikta; reksyāti; rīktā; pass. rīcyāte; caus. recáyati). —1. leave; —2. let go, let free; —3. very rarely (like Eng. colloq. part with), sell.

[w. rīnākti cf. Lat. *linquit*, 'leaves': cf. L-λιπ-ε, 'left'; Lat. *licet*, 'it is left, i.e. permitted' (Eng. *leave* means 'permission'); AS. lēōn, lēh-an, Ger. leih-en, 'leave a thing to a person for a time, einem etwas überlassen, i.e. lend'; AS. lēn, 'gift, loan,' Eng. noun *loan*, whence denom. verb *loan*; fr. lēn comes lēnan, 'give, loan,' Old Eng. lēn-en, preterit lēn-de, whose *d* has become part of the root in Eng. *lend* (though good usage has not sanctioned the precisely similar blunder in *drown-ed-ed*).]

+ ati, mid. (through pass. sense be left over) surpass; predominate; —caus. cause to be in surplus; overdo, 96¹².

v̄ rip (rīrépa; rīptā). —1. smear; stick; smear, and so —2. as in Eng., defile; —3. (with the same metaphor as in the Ger. *an-schmieren*) cheat, impose upon. [the old form of v̄lip: see under v̄lip.]

rīpú, *m.* impostor, cheat; later foe. [v̄rip, 1178b.]

rīprá, *n.* defilement; impurity. [v̄rip, 1188c.]

rīpra-vāhá, *a.* carrying off or removing impurity. [aect, 1270.]

v̄ rīç (rīgáti, -te; rīstā). —1. pull; —2. pull or bite off, crop. [older form of v̄liç.]

v̄ rīş (rēsati; rīsyati, -te [761a]; rīstā; caus. rēsáyati; árīrisati). be hurt; receive harm; caus. harm.

v̄ rī, see ri.

v̄ ru (rāúti [626]; rūváti; ruráva; árāvít; rutá; rótum). cry; yell; howl; hum, 26⁹. [cf. ḡ-ρύ-ομαι, 'howl'; Lat. *raucus*, 'screaming, hoarse'; AS. rýn, 'a roaring.')

ruk̄má, *m.* ornament of gold; as *n.* gold. [v̄ ruc, 1106, 216.5.]

v̄ ruc (rócate, -ti; rurucé, ruróca; árucat, árocis̄ta; rociṣyáte; rucitá; rócitum). —1. shine; be bright or resplendent; —2. appear in splendor; —3. appear beautiful
