पारतन्त्र *n.* Dependence, subservience.

पारात्मिक *a.* (*f. की*) Belonging to the next world, of use in the future life.

पारम्य *n.* Reward in a future state.

पारद *m.* Quick-silver, निर्दर्शनं वारदोऽत्र रसः Bh. V. 1. 82.

पारदारिक *m.* An adulterer, Yaj. II. 195.

पारदार्थ *n.* Adultery, intriguing with another's wife, M. XI. 59.

पारदेशीक I *a.* (*f. की*) Foreign, out-landish. II *m.* A foreigner.

पारदेश्य I *a.* (*f. इयी*) Belonging to a foreign country. II *m.* A foreigner.

पारदृश *n.* A present (probably a misreading for प्राभृत).

पारमहस्य *n.* Most sublime asceticism. COMP.—परि *ind.* relating to the most sublime asceticism.

पारमार्थिक *a.* (*f. की*) 1 Relating to the highest truth, that is, to spiritual knowledge; 2 real, true, really existing, e. g. सत्ता विविधा पारमार्थिकी आवाहारिकी शांतातिकी च; 3 loving truth; 4 excellent, superior.

पारमिक *a.* (*f. की*) Supreme, chief, best.

पारमेश्वर *n.* 1 Supremacy, highest position; 2 royal insignia.

पारंपरीण *a.* (*f. णी*) Handed down from father to son, hereditary.

पारंपरीय *a.* (*f. या*) Handed down, traditional.

पारंपर्य *n.* 1 Hereditary succession; 2 traditional instruction, tradition; 3 intermedi-

ation. COMP.—उपदेश *m.* traditional instruction, tradition, (considered to be a proof by the Pauranikas.) See उपतिष्ठ.

पारिवृष्ट *a.* Able to accomplish anything.

पारलौकिक *a.* (*f. की*) Relating to the next world, Na. v. 92.

पारवत *m.* A pigeon.

पारवद्य *n.* Dependence, subservience.

पारवत *I a.* (*f. की*) 1 Made of iron; 2 relating to an axe. II *m.* 1 Iron; 2 the son of a Brahmana by a S'udra woman, यं ब्राह्मणस्तु शूद्रायां कामादुन्यादप्रेत्युत्तम् । स पारवते व शवस्तस्मात्पारवतः स्मृतः M. ix. 178; 3 an adulterine, a bastard.

पारवध *m.* A man armed with an axe.

पारस *a.* (*f. सी*) Persian.

पारसिक *m.* 1 Persia; 2 a horse of Persian breed.

पारसी *f.* The Persian language.

पारसीक I *m.* 1 Persia; 2 a Persian horse. II *m. pl.* The Persians, पारसीकास्ततो जेतु प्रत्यये ह्यत्वन्मेना R. IV. 60.

पारस्वैर्णेय *m.* An adulterine, a bastard.

पारहस्य *a.* (*f. स्या*) Relating to an ascetic who has subdued his senses.

पारा *f.* Name of a river, पारासरित्यारकरच्छलतो विभिति M. M. IX.

पारापत *m.* A pigeon.

पारावत *m.* 1 A pigeon, a Turkey-pigeon, a dove, कस्याचिद्वनवलौ सुसपारावतायाम् Megh. I. 38; 2 a monkey;

3 a mountain. COMP.—भूमि, पिंडा *m.* a species of pigeon.

पारारूप *m.* A stone, a rock.

पाराशर *m.* An epithet of पराशर्य Vyāsa, son of Parashara.

पाराशरि *m.* An epithet of S'ukra.

पाराशरिन् I *m. pl.* The class of ascetics who study the शारीरस्त्र of Vyāsa. II *m.* A recluse.

पारिकांकित *m.* An ascetic who is given to devout contemplation.

पारिक्षित *m.* A patronymic of Janamejaya, great grandson of Arjuna.

पारित्येय *a.* (*f. यी*) Surrounded by a ditch.

पारिजात *m.* 1 Name of पारिजातक one of the five trees of paradise; (it is described as being produced at the churning of the ocean), कृष्णदुमणामित्र पारिजातः R. VI. 6, x. 11, xvii. 7. (See देवतरु) ; 2 the coral tree.

पारिषाद्य I *a.* (*f. यी*) 1 Relating to marriage; 2 obtained on the occasion of the marriage. II *n.* Property settled on a bride at the time of marriage, e. g. मातृः पारिषाद्य विभिति विभेजनं Vasishtha.

पारिषाल्प *n.* Household furniture, M. ix. 11.

पारित्याय *f.* A string of pearls for binding the hair.

पारितोषिक *n.* A reward, a gratuity, a present, तदगृह्णयति पारितोषिकमिदमंगलीयकम् M. Rich. v.

पारिभूजिक *m.* A standard-bearer.

पारिंद्र *m.* A lion.

पारिपंथिक *m.* A robber, a highway-man.

पारिपात्र *n.* Mode, method, manner.

पारिपार्च *n.* Retinue, attendants.
