

खाटरेय khāṭvareya, as, m. patr. fr. khāṭvara, g. subhrāḍdi (Kāś.).

खाटुभारिक khāṭvābhārīka, mfn. (fr. khāṭvā-bhāra), laden with bedsteads, g. vanṣāḍdi.

Khāṭvika, mfn. (fr. khāṭvā), id., ib.

खाडगडक khāḍaṇḍaka, for shāḍ°.

खाडव khāḍava, for khāṇḍ°, q. v.

खाडायन khāḍāyana, m. patr. fr. Khada, g. i. asvāḍdi; Pāṇ. iv, 3, 104, Vārtt. 2. — **bhakta**, n. a district inhabited by Khāḍyanas, g. aishukāryāḍdi.

Khāḍāyanaka, mfn. fr. °na, g. arīhanḍdi.

Khāḍāyanin, m. pl. (g. śaunakāḍdi) the school of Khāḍāyana, Anup. iii, 5; vii, 9.

Khāḍāyanīya, mfn. fr. °na, g. gahāḍdi.

Khāḍika, āś, m. pl., N. of a school of the Yajur-veda, AV. Pariś. il (for khāṇḍ°?).

Khāḍikī, mfn. fr. khāḍika, g. sutamgamāḍdi.

Khāḍī, f., N. of a locality, Kshitiś. vii, 3.

Khāḍonmatteya, as, m. metron. fr. khāḍonmattā, g. subhrāḍdi.

खाढूरेय khāḍureya, v.l. for khāṭvar°.

खाढ़ khāḍga, mfn. (fr. khadgā), coming from a rhinoceros (as armour made of rhinoceros hide), ŚāṅkhŚr. xiv, 33, 20.

खारः khāḍa, am, n. (fr. khanda), the state of having fractures or fissures or gaps, g. prithvāḍdi.

Khāḍaka, mfn. fr. khāḍa, g. dhūmāḍdi (v.l.) & arīhanḍdi (Kāś.).

Khāḍaparaśava, mfn. (fr. khāḍa-parasu), belonging to Śiva, Bālār. iii, 6.

Khāḍavā, as, am, m. n. sugar-candy, sugar-plums, sweetmeats, MBh. xiii; R. i, vii; N. of a forest in Kuru-kshetra (sacred to Indra and burnt by the god of fire aided by Arjuna and Kṛishṇa, MBh.; Hariv.; BhP. i, 15, 8; Kathās.); TāṇḍyaBr. xxv, 3; TĀr.; (i), f., N. of a town built by Sudarśana, L. — **prastha**, m. (=indra-pr°) N. of a town situated in the Khāḍava forest (founded by the Pāṇḍavas), MBh.; BhP. x. — **rāga**, m. (=rāga-khāḍava)sugar-candy, sweetmeats, MBh. xiv, 2684.

Khāḍavaka, mfn. fr. khāḍu, g. arīhanḍdi.

Khāḍavāyana, āś, m. pl., N. of a family of Brāhmans, MBh. iii, 10208.

Khāḍavika. See rāga-kh°.

Khāḍa-virāṇa, g. arīhanḍdi (in Kāś. two separate words khāḍa & virāṇa; cf. Gaṇar. 286).

Khāḍavirāṇaka, mfn. fr. °na, ib.

Khāḍāyana, pl., N. of a family, Pravar. ii, 3, 1.

Khāḍika, as, m. (fr. khāḍa), a seller of sugar-plums, confectioner, L.; (pl.) the whole number of pupils, Gobh. iii, 3, 8; N. of a school of the black Yajur-veda, Caran.; (am), n. a multitude of pupils (? cf. khāṇḍ°), Pāṇ. iv, 2, 45.

Khāḍikīya, āś, m. pl. (Pāṇ. iv, 3, 102) ‘the followers of Khāḍika,’ N. of a school of the black Yajur-veda, Caran.

Khāḍikeya, m. pl., id., DeviP. (=Caran.)

Khāḍikya, as, m., N. of Janaka, VP. vi, 6, 5 ff.; of Mita-dhvaja, BhP. ix, 13, 20; n. (fr. khāḍika), the state of a pupil (?), g. purohitāḍdi. — **janaka**, m., N. of Janaka, VP. vi, 5, 81; 6, 8.

Khāḍiti, mfn. fr. khāḍita, g. sutamgamāḍdi.

Khāḍitya, mfn. id., g. pragadyāḍdi.

खात् khāṭ, v.l. for khāṭ, q. v.

खात khāṭā, khāṭaka, &c. See √khan, p. 337.

खात्मन् khāṭman. See 3. khā, p. 334.

खाद khāḍ, cl. 1. P. khāḍati (ep. also Ā.

°te; aor. akhāḍit, Bhatṭ.; perf. cakhāḍa, ib.), to chew, bite, eat, devour, feed, prey upon, RV. i, 64, 7; AV.; VS. &c.; to hurt, Suśr.; to ruin, Subh.: Caus. P. khāḍayati, to cause to be eaten or devoured by (instr.; cf. Pāṇ. i, 4, 52, Vārtt. 5), Gaut.; Mn.; Heat.; to eat or devour, MBh. iii, 2435: Desid. cikhāḍishati, to desire to eat, MBh. vii, 205 (v.l.); HYog. iii, 18.

Khāḍā, mfn. ‘eating, devouring,’ ifc., see amitra- & vrītra-khāḍā; m. eating, devouring, AitBr. v, 12, 10; food, AV. ix, 6, 12; ŠBr. xiii, 4, 2, 17.

Khāḍaka, as, m. (Pāṇ. iii, 2, 146) an eater, devourer, Gobh.; Mn. v, 51; MBh. xiii; a debtor, borrower (cf. khāṭaka), Comm. on Yājñ.; (ikā), f. ‘eating,’ ifc., e.g. abhyūsha-, bisa-, qq. vv.

Khāḍag-dát, mfn. one who has biting teeth (Sch.), TĀr. i, 12, 4.

Khāḍata (Impv. 2. pl. fr. √khāḍ, q. v.) — **mo-**datā, f. (Impv. 2. pl. fr. √mud) ‘eat and rejoice,’ continual eating and rejoicing, g. mayūra-vyan-sakāḍdi. — **vamatā**, f. (Impv. 2. pl. fr. √vam) continual eating and vomiting, ib. (v.l.) **Khāḍatā-camatā**, f. (Impv. 2. pl. fr. ā-√cam) continual eating and rinsing the mouth, ib.

Khāḍana, m. a tooth, L.; n. chewing, eating, Vop.; food, victuals, R. ii, 50, 25 & 31; (ā), f., N. of a wife of king Megha-vāhana, Rājat. iii, 14.

Khāḍaniya, mfn. eatable, edible, Lalit.; Divyāv.

Khāḍikā. See °daka.

Khāḍas, m. ‘devouring,’ only in comp. **Khā-**do-arna or °rnas, mfn. ‘having a devouring flood,’ i.e. having a flood that carries away the bank (said of a river), RV. v, 45, 2 (Naigh. i, 13).

Khāḍitā, mfn. eaten, devoured, ŠBr. iii; Suśr.; Bhatṭ.; Hit. — **vat**, mfn. having eaten, iii, 6, 4.

Khāḍitavya, mfn. to be eaten, iv, 5, 4.

Khāḍitṛi, m. an eater, devourer, MBh. xii, 846.

1. **Khāḍin**, mfn. ifc. eating, Mn. iv, 71 (=MBh. xiii, 4968).

Khāḍuka, mfn. mischievous, injurious, L.

Khāḍya, am, n. ‘eatable, edible,’ food, victuals, MBh. ii, 98; Pañcat. i; Bhartṛ.; (as), m. (=khāḍira) Acacia Catechu, Gal.; (cf. khāḍa-kh°). **Khāḍyākhāḍya**, mfn. fit or unfit for food, W.

Khāḍyaka, as, m., N. of a particular food, Gal.

खादाक्ष khāḍākya, fr. khadākā, g. kurvāḍdi (Hemac.; shāḍākā, Gaṇar., Sch.)

खादि khāḍi, m. (f.?) a brooch, ring (worn on the hands or feet by the Maruts), RV. i, v, vii; (cf. vrīsha-, hiranya-; su-khāḍi.) — **hasta** (khāḍi-), mfn. having the hands ornamented with bracelets or rings (said of the Maruts), v, 38, 2.

2. **Khāḍin**, mfn. decorated with bracelets or rings (as the Maruts), RV. ii, 34, 2; vi, 16, 40 (perhaps = khāḍi); x, 38, 1.

खादिर khāḍirā, mf(i)n. (g. palāśāḍdi) made of or coming from the Khadira tree (Acacia Catechu), TS. iii; ŠBr.; AitBr.; Kauś.; Mn. &c.; (as), m. = -rasa, L.; (i), f. (perhaps) N. of a locality, g. nadyāḍdi. — **grīhya**, n., N. of a work. — **sāra**, m. Catechu (resinous extract of the Khadira tree), L.

Khāḍiraka, mfn. fr. khadīrā, gaṇas arīhanḍdi & varāḍdi.

Khāḍirāyā, m. patr. fr. khadīrā, g. asvāḍdi. **Khāḍireya**, mfn. fr. °ri, g. nadyāḍdi.

खादुक khāḍuka. See √khāḍ.

खादूरक khāḍūraka, as, m. patr. fr. kha-d°, g. sivāḍdi (for khāṭvar°?).

खादोञ्चर्ण khāḍo-arṇa, &c. See √khāḍ.

खाधूया khāḍhūyā, f., N. of an Agra-hāra, Rājat. v, 23.

खान 1. **khāṇa**, am, n. (fr. √khāḍ?), eating, GaruḍaP. **Khānōdaka**, m. the cocoa-nut tree, L.

2. **khāṇa**, as, m. (=خان) a Khan (or Mogul emperor), Rājat. — **khāṇa**, m., N. of a Khan (or Mogul emperor), Vaidyajiv., Sch. Concl.

Khāṇā-rāya, m., N. of a man (A.D. 1500).

खानक khāṇaka, °ni, °nika, &c. See √khan.

खानिष्क khāṇishka, as, m. a kind of dish (consisting of small pieces of meat prepared with spices), Suśr. i, 46, 8, 24; Madanav.

Khāṇishṭa, am, n. id., Madanav.

खानुल khāṇula, m., N. of a man (father of Bahula, Virac. vi; of Vopula, xix f., xxii).

खान्य khāṇya. See √khan, p. 337, col. 1.

खापगा khāḍpagā, khāḍpara. See 3. khā, p. 334.

खार khāra, as, m. (ifc., Pāṇ. v, 4, 101) a measure of grain (commonly Khāri, = 18 Dronas or about 3 bushels; it is also reckoned at 1½ Šūrpas or 3 Dronas; also at 46 Gauṇis or 4096 Palas, or at 4 Dronas), Pāṇ. ii, 3, 46, Sch. (°ri, Kāś.); (i), f. id., RV. iv, 32, 17; Pāṇ.; Pañcat.; Rājat. — **śā-**tika, mfn. containing or sown with a hundred Khāri measures, Pat. on Pāṇ. v, 1, 58, Vārtt. 6. — **sahasrika**, mfn. containing or sown with a thousand Khāri measures, ib.

Khāri, is, f. (ifc., Pāṇ. v, 4, 101, Kāś.) = khāra, Siddh. stry. 32. — **grīvi**, v.l. for °ragr°.

Khārim (in comp. for °rim, acc. of °ri (q. v.), or shortened acc. of °ri). — **dhama**, mfn.? Pāṇ. iii, 2, 29, Pat.; (cf. kharim-dh°). — **dhaya**, mfn.? ib.; (cf. kharim-dh°). — **paca**, mfn. ‘cooking a Khāri by measure,’ (a vessel) in which a Khāri may be cooked, Pāṇ. iii, 2, 33, Kāś.

Khārika, mfn. = °rika, L., Sch.; (ā), f. = khā-ra, Sarvad. v, 38.

Khārī, f. of °ra, q.v. — **jaṅgha**, for khar°, Kāś. — **vāpa**, mfn. sown with a Khāri of grain, L.

Khārika, mfn. (Pāṇ. v, 1, 33, Vārtt. 1) sown with a Khāri of grain, v, 1, 45, Kāś.; (ifc.) v, 1, 33.

खारग्रीव khāragrīvi, m. pl. (patr. fr. khārigrīvan) N. of a family, Pravar. ii, 2, 1.

Khāranādi, m. pl. (patr. fr. khāra-nādin, g. bāhv-āḍdi), id., ib. (°raṇādi, MSS.)

Khārapāyāna, patr. fr. khāra-pa, g. 1. naḍḍdi.

Khārikhana, m. pl. the descendants of Khāri-khan, Gaṇar. 31, Sch.

खाकार khār-kāra, as, m. (khār, onomat., probably connected with khāra) the braying of an ass, BhP. iii, 17, 11.

खार्खोट khārkhoṭa = kharkhoda, q.v.

खार्गल khārgali, is, m. patr. fr. khārgāla, Kāsh. xxx, 2; TāṇḍyaBr. xvii, 4, 3.

खार्जुरकर्ण khārjurakarṇa, for °rjūr°.

Khārjūra, mfn. (fr. khārj°), coming from or made of Phoenix sylvestris, Suśr.; Mn. xi, 96, Sch.

Khārjūrakarṇa, as, m. patr. fr. khārjūra-k°, g. sivāḍdi.

Khārjūrāyāna, patr. fr. khārjūra, g. asvāḍdi.
