पारद् 2. pārada, m. (cf. *pārata*), quicksilver, Var.; Suśr. (-*tva*, n., Sarvad.); m. N. of a partic. personification, SāmavBr.; pl. N. of a people or of a degraded tribe, Mn.; MBh. &c. (cf. IW. 229, n. 1). — **kalpa**, m. N. of wk.

पारवव् pārabava, n. N. of 2 Sāmans, ĀrshBr.

पारम् pārama, Vṛiddhi form of *parama* in comp. — **gopucchika**, mfn. = *parama-gopucchena kṛitam*, Pat. — **rsha** (*pō + rishi*), mfn. coming from a great Rishi, Sarvad. — **sthya**, n. (fr. *parama-stha*), g. *brāhmaṇḍdi-*. — **hansa**, mf(i)n. relating to Parama-hansa (s.v.), BhP. — **hansya**, mfn. id., ib.; n. the state or condition of a Pō-hō, ib.; -*pari*, ind. relating to the most sublime meditation, MW. — **Pāramārthika**, mf(i)n. (fr. *paramārtha*) relating to a high or spiritual object or to supreme truth, real, essential, true, Śāmk.; BhP.; Kull. (cf. N. of a mixed caste, the son of a Brāhmaṇ by a Sūdra woman (f. ī), Mn.; MBh. (-*tva*, n.); Var.; a son by another’s wife, a bastard, L.; pl. N. of a people in the south-west of Madhya-deśa, Var.; MārkP.

Pāraśavāyana, m. patr. fr. *pāraśava*; g. *biddādi*.

Pāraśavya, m. patr. of Tirindira, Śāṅkhśr.

पारशीक pāraśīka = *pārasīka*.

पारश्वध pāraśvadha and *ōdhika*, mf(i)n. (fr. *paraśvadha*) armed with an axe, L. (cf. Pāṇ. iv, 4, 58).

N. of wks.

पारस्त् pārastava, mf(i)n. (fr. *parasvat*) relating &c. to the wild ass, AV.

पारापत् pārāpata, m. = (or v. l. for) *pārāvata*, a pigeon, Kād. — **padī**, f. *Cardiospermum Halicacabum* or *Leea Hirta*, L.

Pārāpataka, m. a kind of rice, Suśr.

पारारुक् pārāruka, m. a rock, L. (cf. *paratiṣṭa*).

पारावत् pārāvata, mf(i)n. (fr. *parā-vat*) remote, distant, coming from a distance, foreign, RV. (instr. pl. ‘from distant quarters,’ AV.); m. N. of a tribe on the Yamunā, RV.; TāṇḍBr.; (ifc. f. ī) a turtle-dove, pigeon, MBh.; Kāv. &c.; a kind of snake, Suśr.; N. of a Nāga of the race of Airāvata, MBh.; a monkey, L.; *Diospyros Embryopteris*, MBh.; Hariv.; Suśr.; a mountain, L.; pl. N. of a class of deities under Manu Śārocisha, Pur.; (ī), f. the fruit of *Diospyros Embryopteris*, Hariv.; Suśr. — **ghnī**, f. (of *han*) striking the distant (demon) or at a distance, RV. vi, 61, 2. — **deśa**, m. N. of a country, Cat. — **padī**, f. *Cardiospermum Halicacabum*, BhPr.; Car. — **mālāya**, Nom. N. of wks. — **sāri**, m. patr. of Vyāsa, L. — **sārin**, m. a mendicant of the order of Pārāśarya, L. (cf. Pāṇ. iv, 3, 110); pl. N. of a phil. school, RāmatUp. — **sāri** (pārā-), f. patr. of Parāśara, ŚBr.; a wk. of Pō; -*kaunḍini-pūtra* and *ōri-pūtra* (pārā-), m.
