**Pippalāyani**, m. N. of a teacher, ib. (v.l. *paipp*<sup>o</sup>).

**Pippali**, f. long pepper, Āpast.; n. (with *Vasishṭhasya*) N. of a Sāman. — **śroni**, f. N. of a river, MārkP.

**Pippali**, f. a berry, AV.; Piper Longum (both plant and berry), R.; Var.; Suśr. — **mūla**, n. the root of long pepper, Bhpr.; <sup>o</sup>liya, mfn., g. <sup>o</sup>utkarḍdi. — **lavāna**, n. du. pepper and salt, R. — **vardhamāna** and <sup>o</sup>naka, n. N. of a partic. kind of medical treatment in which grains of pepper are given in increasing and decreasing quantity, Suśr.

**Pippalū**, m. N. of a man, g. *gargaddi*.

**पिप्पका** *pippikā*, f. the tartar of the teeth, L. (cf. *piṭṭaka*).

**पिप्पीका** *pippikā*, f. a species of bird, Var.

**पिप्पटा** *piṭṭa*, f. sugar, L.

**पिप्रोपा** *piṭṭhā*, f. (<sup>o</sup>prī, Desid.) desire of pleasing or showing kindness, R.; Var., Car. — **shu**, mfn. wishing to give pleasure, MBh.; Hariv.

**पिप्रु** *pípru*, m. (<sup>o</sup>prī) N. of a demon conquered by Indra, RV.

**पिप्रु** *piplu*, m. (pi for *api* + *plu*?) a freckle, mark, mole, Nal. — **karṇa**, mfn. having a mark on the ear, Kathās. — **pracchādana**, mfn. covering or concealing a mole, Nal.

**पिब** *piba*, mfn. (<sup>o</sup>i. pā) drinking, who or what drinks, Pān. iii, 1. 137 (cf. *tri-*).

**Piba-vat**, mfn. containing a form of the verb *pibati*, AitBr.

**पिव्व** *pibd* (prob. = *pi-pad*), only pr. p. Ā. *pibdamāna*, becoming or being firm or solid, ŠBr.

**Pibdanā**, mfn. firm, hard, solid, compact, ŠBr.

**पियारु** *piyāru*, mfn. (<sup>o</sup>pīy) censuring, mocking, overbearing, mischievous, RV.; AV.

**पियाल** *piyāla*, m. (for *piyāla*, q. v.) the tree *Buchanania Latifolia* (in Bengal commonly called Piyal); n. its fruit, MBh.; Hariv.; R. — **bīja**, n. the seed of the Piyal tree, R. — **majjā**, f. the marrow of the Piyal tree, ib.

**पिम्परि** *pimparior* <sup>o</sup>rī, f. *Ficus Infectoria*, L.

**पिम्पला** *pimpalā*, f. N. of a river, Rājat. (perhaps w.r. for *pippalā*).

**पियाक** *piyāka*, m. N. of a poet, Cat. (cf. *piyāka*).

**पिल** *pil*, cl. 10. P. *pelayati*, to throw, send, impel, incite, Dhātup. xxxii, 65 (cf. *pel*, *vil*).

**Pilu** or <sup>o</sup>luka, m. a species of tree (= *pilu*), Suśr. — **parṇi**, f. *Sansevieria Roxburghiana*, Car.

**पिलि** *pili*, m. N. of a man, Samskārak.

**पिलिन्दवत्स** *pilinda-vatsa*, m. N. of a disciple of Gautama Buddha, SaddhP.

**पिलिपिच्छ** *pilipiccha*, <sup>o</sup>picchi, <sup>o</sup>picchika or <sup>o</sup>piñja, m. N. of a demon, Hcat.; AgP.

**पिलिप्पिल** *pilippilā*, mf(ā)n. slippery, VS. (Mahidh.)

**Pilpilā**, mf(ā)n. id., MaitrS.; (ā), f. N. of Lakshmi, Gal.

**पिल्ला** *pillā*, mfn. blear-eyed; m. a bleared eye, L. (cf. *paillya*).

**Pillakā**, f. a female elephant, W.

**पिश्श** 1. *piś* (*piṇś*), cl. 6. P. (Dhātup. xxviii, 143) *piṇśati*, Ved. also Ā. <sup>o</sup>te (pf. *pipeśa*, *pipeśe*, <sup>o</sup>sre, RV.; aor. p. *piśānā*, ib.;

*apeśīt*, Gr.; fut. *peśishyati*, *peśitā*, Gr.), to hew out, carve, prepare (esp. meat), make ready, adorn (Ā. also ‘one’s self’); to form, fashion, mould, RV.; TBr.: Pass. *piṣyātē*, AV.: Caus. *peśayati*, aor. *apipīsat*, Gr.: Desid. *pipeśishati* or *pipeśishati*, ib.: Intens. see *peśisat*, *sāna*. **Piśā**, m. = *ruru*, a sort of deer (probably so called from its colour; cf. next), RV. i, 64, 8 (Sāy.); (ā), f. *Nardostachys Jatamansi*, L.

**Piśāṅga**, mf(ā)n. reddish, r<sup>o</sup>-brown or -yellow, tawny, RV. &c. &c.; m. a r<sup>o</sup> or tawny colour, W.; N. of a serpent-demon, TāṇḍBr.; MBh. — **jāta**, m. ‘having a reddish braid of hair,’ N. of an ascetic, Kathās. — **tā**, f. (Sīś.), -tva, n. (Mcar.), r<sup>o</sup> or tawny colour. — **bhrishtī** (*piśāṅga*), mfn. having r<sup>o</sup> prongs, RV. i, 133, 5. — **rāti**, mfn. giving r<sup>o</sup> i.e. golden gifts, RV. — **rūpa** and **samdrīś** (*piśāṅga*), of a r<sup>o</sup> or yellow appearance, RV.; AV. — **piśāṅgāśva**, mfn. having r<sup>o</sup> or tawny horses, RV.

**Piśāṅgaka**, m. N. of an attendant of Vishnu, BrahmaP.

**Piśāṅgaya**, Nom. P. <sup>o</sup>yati, to dye reddish, Kir.

**Piśāṅgita**, mfn. dyed reddish-yellow, Kād.

**Piśāṅgilā**, mf(ā)n. reddish, VS.

**Piśāṅgi-<sup>o</sup>kri**, to dye reddish, Mudr.

**Piśācā**, m. (ifc. f. ā) N. of a class of demons (possibly so called either from their fondness for flesh [*piśa* for *piśita*] or from their yellowish appearance; they were perhaps originally a personification of the ignis fatuus; they are mentioned in the Veda along with Asuras and Rākshasas, see also Mn. xii, 44; in later times they are the children of Krodhā, cf. IW. 276); a fiend, ogre, demon, imp, malevolent or devilish being, AV. &c. &c. (ifc. ‘a devil of a —’, Kād.); N. of a Rakshas, R.; (ā), f. N. of a daughter of Daksha and mother of the Piśācas, VP.; (ā), f. a female P<sup>o</sup>, a she-devil, AV. &c. &c. (also ifc. = m.); excessive fondness for (ifc.; e.g. *āyudha*-p<sup>o</sup>, e<sup>o</sup>f<sup>o</sup> for fighting), Bālar.; Anarghar.; a species of Valerian, L.; N. of a Yogini, Hcat.

— **kāla-cakra-yuddha-varṇana**, n. N. of wk. — **kshāyana**, mfn. destroying Piśācas, AV. — **grīhitaka**, m. one possessed of P<sup>o</sup>s or demons, Kād.

— **caryā**, f. the practice of P<sup>o</sup>s, BhP. — **cātana**, mfn. driving away P<sup>o</sup>s, AV. — **jāmbhana**, mfn. crushing P<sup>o</sup>s, ib. — **tā**, f., -tva, n. the state or condition of a P<sup>o</sup>, demoniacal nature, Kāv.; Kathās.

— **dakshinā**, f. a gift (such as given) among P<sup>o</sup>s, MBh. — **dīpikā**, f. ‘lamp of the P<sup>o</sup>s,’ an ignis fatuus, MW. — **dru**, m. *Trophis Aspera* (the favourite haunt of P<sup>o</sup>s), L. — **pati**, m. ‘lord of P<sup>o</sup>s,’ N. of Śiva, Kāv. — **bādhā**, f. demoniacal possession, MW.

— **bhikshā**, f. alms (such as given) among P<sup>o</sup>s, Āpast. (cf. *-dakshinā*). — **mocana**, n. ‘deliverance of the P<sup>o</sup>s,’ N. of ch. of SkandaP.; = -tīrtha, ib.; -kathana, n. N. of ch. of KürmaP.; -tīrtha, n. N. of a sacred bathing-place, SkandaP. — **vadana**, mfn. having the face of a P<sup>o</sup>, Mcar. — **vidyā-veda**, m. the Veda of the P<sup>o</sup>s, ĀśvSr. — **vṛiksha**, m. = -dru, L. — **veda**, m. = -vidyā-veda, GopBr. — **śvan**, m. ‘dog-P<sup>o</sup>s,’ N. of a demon malevolently disposed towards children, ĀpGr., Sch. — **samcāra**, m. = -bādhā, MW. — **sabha**, n. assemblage of P<sup>o</sup>s or fiends, pandemonium, L. — **han**, mfn. ‘slaying P<sup>o</sup>s,’ Kāth. — **Piśācāṅganā**, f. a female P<sup>o</sup>, a she-devil, Prab. — **Piśācālaya**, m. ‘abode of P<sup>o</sup>s,’ phosphorescence, Var. — **Piśācōdumbara**, m. a species of tree, ĀpGr., Sch. — **Piśācōraga-rāksha-sa**, m. pl. **Piśācī-karana**, n. transforming into a Piśāca, Cat.

**Piśitā**, mfn. made ready, prepared, dressed, adorned, AV.; (ā), f. *Nardostachys Jatamansi*, L.; n. (also pl.) flesh which has been cut up or prepared, any flesh or meat, AV. &c. &c.; a small piece, AV.

vi, 127, 1. — **nibha**, mfn. resembling flesh, Suśr.

— **pañkāvanaddhāsthi-pañjara-maya**, mf(ā)n.

consisting of a skeleton of bones covered with flaccid flesh, Prab.

N. of a river (described as the Mandākini), R. (cf
