

Peshana, n. pounding, grinding (of grain), KātyŚr.; Hcat.; crushing (°*naṃ*√*yā*, to be crushed), MärkP.; a threshing floor, L.; a hand-mill, L.; Euphorbia Antiquorum, L.; (ī), f., see below. — **vat**, mfn. a word formed for the explanation of *pipishvat*, Sāy.

Peshani, f. = next, L.

Peshanī, f. a grind-stone, Mn. iii, 68. — **pu-traka**, m. a small grind-stone, L.

Peshaniya, mfn. to be ground or pounded or pulverized, MW.

Peshāka, m. a small grind-stone, L.

Peshi, m. a thunderbolt, L.

1. **Peshī**, ind. for *pēsha*. — √**kri** (ind. p. -*kṛitya* or -*kṛitvā*), to crush, pound, MBh. (cf. 2. *peśī*).

Peshṭri, mfn. who or what pounds or grinds, Kull.

Peshya, mfn. = *peshanīya*; (ifc.) to be ground into, Suśr.

पेषु *peshṭra*, n. (√*piś*) a bone, AV.

पेस *pes*, cl. 1. P. *pesati*, to go (= *piś*), Dhātup. xvii, 69.

Pésuka, mfn. (√*piś*) spreading, extending, ŚBr.

Pesvara, mfn. (Pāṇ. iii, 2, 175) going, moving, W.; destructive, ib.; splendid, ib.

पै *pai*, cl. 1. P. *pāyati*, to dry, wither, Dhātup. xxii, 23.

पैङ्ग *painga*, mfn. (fr. *piṅga*) relating to a rat or mouse, Kauś.; m. N. of a teacher (prob. w. r. for *gya*); n. N. of wk. — **rājā**, m. a kind of bird, VS.

Paingākshī-putra, m. and °**triya**, mfn. (fr. *paingākshī-putra*), Pāṇ. iv, 2, 28, Vārtt. 1; 2, Pat.

Paingāyani-brāhmaṇa, n. N. of wk., ĀpŚr.

Paingī, m. patr. of Yāska, L.

Paingīn, mfn. derived from *Paingya*, Pāṇ., Sch.; m. a follower of P°, Anup. — **Paingī-rahasya-brāhmaṇa**, n. N. of wk.

Paingī, f. of °*gya*. **Paingī-pūtra**, m. N. of a teacher, ŚBr.

Paingya, m. patr. of a teacher, Br.; MBh.; n. the doctrine of P°, Br. — **smṛiti**, f. N. of wk.

Paingyāyana-brāhmaṇa, n. N. of wk. (cf. *Paingāyani-br°*).

पैङ्गरायण *paingarāyana*, m. patr. fr. *piṅ-gara*, g. *naḍḍi*.

पैङ्गल *paingala*, m. (sg. and pl.) patr. fr. *piṅgala*, g. *kanvādi*; n. the manual of *Piṅgala*. — **kāva**, m. pl. the followers of *Piṅgala-kāva*, Pāṇ. i, 1, 173, Vārtt. 8, Pat. **Paingalōpanishad**, f. N. of wk.

Paingalāyana (g. *naḍḍi*), °**yani** (Samskarak.; cf. next), m. patr. fr. *piṅgala*.

Paingalāyāni, m., g. *pailādi* (Kās. *paingalāyāni*).

Paingalya, m. patr. fr. *piṅgala*, g. *gargādi*; n. brown or tawny colour, Suśr.

पैच्छिल्य *paicchilya*, n. (fr. *picchila*) sliminess, mucilaginousness, Suśr.

पैज *paija*, m. N. of a teacher, BhP.

पैजवन *pajavana*, m. (fr. *pajavana*) patr. of Su-dās and of several men, RV. &c. &c.

पैजूलायन *paijūlayana*, patr. fr. *pījūla*, g. *atvādi*.

पैजूष *paijūsha*, m. the ear, L. (cf. *piñ-jūsha*, *peñjūsha*).

पैठक *paithaka* or *paithāka*, m. patr. fr. *pi-ṭhaka*, g. *śivādi*.

Paithākika, mfn. = *piṭhākena harati*, g. *utsaṅ-gādi*.

पैठकलायन *paithakalāyana*, m. sg. and pl. patron., Samskarak.

पैठर *paithara*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *piṭhara*) cooked in a saucepan, R.

Paitharika, m. (prob.) one who uses a saucepan for making musical sounds, Pat.

पैठसर्प *paithasarpa*, mfn. (fr. *piṭha-sarpiṇ*), Pāṇ. vi, 4, 144, Vārtt. 1, Pat.

Paithika, m. (prob.) patr. fr. *piṭha*, Hariv.

पैठीन *paithina*, m. = next, Cat.

Paithinasi, m. patr. of an ancient teacher (a Muni and author of a system of laws), AVParīś.; Pravar. &c. — **smṛiti**, f. N. of wk.

Paithinasya, m. patr., Samskarak.

पैडिक *paidika*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *piḍakā*) relating to boils or pustules, Suśr.

पैड *paidva*, w. r. for *paidva*.

पैण *paiṇ*, cl. 1. P. *paiṇati*, to go; to send; to embrace, Dhātup. xiii, 15 (cf. *peṇ*).

पैण्डपातिक *paṇḍapātika*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *piṇḍa-pāta*) living on alms, Buddh.

Paṇḍāyana, m. patr. fr. *piṇḍa*, g. *naḍḍi*.

Paṇḍikya, n. (fr. *piṇḍika*), g. *purohitādi*.

Paṇḍinya, n. (fr. *piṇḍin*), L. °**dya**, n. metron. (fr. *piṇḍī*), Pāṇ. iv, 1, 151.

पैतदारव *paitadārava*, mfn. (fr. *pīta-dāru*), g. *rajatādi*.

पैतरावण *paitarāvana*, m. patr. (fr. *pīta-rāvana?*), Pravar.

पैता *paitā*, Vṛiddhi form of *pitā* in comp.

— **putriya**, mfn. relating to father and son, KātyŚr.

— **maha**, mf(ī)n. relating to or derived from a grandfather, AitBr.; MBh.; relating to or derived from or presided over by Brahmā, MBh.; Kāv. &c.; m. B°'s son (patr. of Manu), MBh.; (pl.) forefathers, ancestors, MW.; n. the lunar mansion called Rohiṇī, Var.; — **tīrtha**, n. N. of a Tīrtha, ŚivaP.; — **siddhānta**, m., °**hī-bhāshya**, n. N. of wks. — **mahaka**, mfn. belonging or relating to a grandfather, Pāṇ. iii, 4, 77, Sch.

Paitri, Vṛiddhi form of *pitri* in comp. — **kriyā**, f. N. of wk. — **matyā**, mfn. sprung from one who has an illustrious father, ĀpŚr., Sch.; m. the grandson of an illustrious man, VS.; Pravar. (g. *kurv-ādī*).

— **medhika**, mfn. relating to a sacrifice to the Pitris; m. or n. N. of wk.; — **vidhāna**, n., — **vidhāna-prayoga**, m., — **vidhi**, m., — **sūtra**, n. N. of wks.

— **yajñika** (Lāṭy.), — **yajñiya** (Mn.), mfn. = **medhika**. — **shvaseya**, mf(ī)n. sprung from a father's sister or paternal aunt, Mn.; MBh. (cf. Pāṇ. iv, 1, 133); m. a f°'s s°'s son, BhP.; (ī), f. a f°'s s°'s daughter, Mn. xi, 171. — **shvasriya**, mfn. = prec., Pāṇ. iv, 1, 132.

Paitrika, mf(ī)n. belonging to a father, paternal, ancestral, Mn.; MBh. &c.; relating or sacred to the Pitris, Rājat.; n. a sacred rite or Śrāddha in honour of deceased ancestors, MBh. — **tithi-nirṇaya**, m. N. of wk. — **dhana**, n. ancestral property, patrimony, MW. — **bhūmi**, f. the country of one's ancestors; a paternal estate, W. — **vidhāna**, n. N. of wk. — **shvaseya**, m., °**yī**, f. = **paitri-sh°** above.

Paitra, mf(ī)n. = **paitrika**, ŚāṅkhŚr.; MBh.; n. a partic. part of the hand (cf. *pitri-tīrtha*), W.

Paitrāhorātra, m. a day and night of the Pitris (= one month), W.

Paitrika, (prob.) w. r. for **paitrika**.

Paitrya, mf(ī)n. relating or belonging to the Pitris, MärkP.; Suśr.

पैतुदारव *paitudārava*, mfn. relating to or derived from the tree *Pitu-dāru*, Br.; ŚrS.

Paitudrava, mfn. = *daivadārava*, ŚāṅkhŚr., Sch.

पैत *paitta*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *pitta*) relating to the bilious humour, bilious, Suśr.

Paittika, mf(ī)n. id., ib.; of a bilious temperament, Var.

पैतल *paittala*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *pittala*) made of brass, brazen, L.

पैड *paidvā*, m. (scil. *aśva*) the serpent-killing horse of *Pedu*, RV.

पैनडक *painaddhaka*, mfn. (fr. *pi-naddha*), g. *varāhādi*.

पैनाक *paināka*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *pinākin*) belonging to or coming from *Rudra-Śiva*, R.; m. patr. fr. *pināka*, Pravar.

पैन्य *painya*, n. (fr. *pīna*) fatness, thick-ness, Dhātup. ix, 46.

पैप्पल *paippala*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *pippala*) made

of the wood of the holy fig-tree, Mcar. °**lava**, mfn., g. *kanvādi*. °**lavya**, m. (fr. *pippalū*), g. *gargādi*.

Paippalāda, mf(ī)n. derived from *Pippalāda*, GarbhUp.; m. patr. fr. *pippalāda*; pl. N. of a school of the AV.; °**dōpanishad**, f. N. of an Up. °**daka**, mf(ī)n. peculiar to or taught by *Pippalāda* or *Paippalāda*; n. the treatise or text of *Pippalāda*, Pāṇ. iv, 2, 104, Vārtt. 23, Pat. °**di**, m. patr. of a teacher, Pravar.; MBh.; Hariv.; (pl.) N. of a school of the AV., Col.

Paippalāyani, m. patr. of a teacher, VP. (cf. *pippalāyani*).

Paippali-kacchapa, mfn., Kās. on Pāṇ. iv, 2, 126.

पैयवन *paiyavana*, w. r. for *paijavana*.

पैयूष *paiyūsha*, mfn. (fr. *pīyūsha*), g. *tālādi*.

पैयूष *paiyūsha*, n. = *pīyūsha*, L.

पैल *paila*, m. (metron. fr. *pīlā*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 118) N. of a teacher (a sage and promulgator of the Rig-veda), GrS.; MBh. &c. — **garga**, m. N. of a man, MBh. — **garbha**, m. 'offspring of P°', N. of a man, MW. — **melī**, m. patr., Samskarak. — **śyāparṇeya**, m. pl., g. *kārta-kaujapādi*. — **sūtra-bhāshya**, n. N. of wk.

Pailiya, m. pl. the disciples of *Paila*, Pat.

Paileya, m. metron. fr. *pīlā*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 118.

पैलव *pailava*, mf(ī)n. made of the wood of the *Pilu* tree (as the staff borne by a *Vaiśya*), Mn.; Gaut.

Pailu, Vṛiddhi form of *pīlu* in comp. — **kuṇa**, mfn., g. *utsādi*. — **mūla**, mfn. = *pīlu-mūle diyate kāryam vā*, g. *vyushādi*. — **vaha**, °**haka**, Pāṇ. iv, 2, 122, Sch. — **śīrshī**, m., — **śīrshyā**, f., Pāṇ. vi, 1, 61, Vārtt. 3, Pat.

पैल्य *pailya*, m., v. l. for *paila*, ĀrshBr.

पैल्य *paillya*, n. (fr. *pilla*) blear-eyedness, Car.

पैल्य *pailva*, m., v. l. for *paila*, ĀrshBr.

Pailvakāyana, m. sg. and pl. patr., Samskarak.

पैशल्य *paisalya*, n. (fr. *peśala*) graciousness, affability, MBh.

पैशाच *paisāca*, mf(ī)n. relating or belonging to the *Pisācas*, demon-like, infernal, GrS.; Mn.; MBh. &c. (with *graha*, m. demoniacal possession, MBh.); m. a *Pisāca* or kind of demon (also as N. of a tribe), MBh. (cf. g. *parśv-ādī*); the eighth or lowest form of marriage (when a lover secretly embraces a damsel either sleeping or intoxicated or disordered in her intellect), Mn. iii, 34; (ī), f. a present made at a religious ceremony to secure friendly regard, W.; (in dram.) a sort of jargon spoken by demons on the stage (cf. *pisāca-bhāshā*); night, L.; n. N. of wk. — **bhāshya**, n. N. of Comm. on Bhag.

Paisācika, mf(ī)n. relating to the *Pisācas*, demoniacal (cf. *cūlikā-p°*).

Paisācya, n. demoniacal nature, BhP.

पैशुन *paisuna*, n. (fr. *pisuna*) tale-bearing, backbiting, calumny, malignity, wickedness, Mn.; MBh. &c.

Paisunika, mfn. slanderous, Divyāv.

Paisunya, n. = *paisuna*, n., Mn.; MBh. &c. (— *vādin*, mfn. slanderous, Daś.); = *bhikshāsītva*, L. (prob. w. r. for *paṇḍinya*).

पैष्ट *paishṭa*, mf(ī)n. (fr. *pishṭa*) made of flour, ground or made up into a cake, Grīhyās.; Hcat.; m. patr. fr. *pishṭa*, g. *śivādi*; (ī), f. spirituous liquor distilled from rice or other grain, L. (cf. RTL. 193).

Paishṭika, mf(ī)n. made of meal or flour, Suśr.; (ā), f. = *paishṭī*; n. a quantity of cakes, L.

पैसुकायन *paisukāyana*, m. patr., Pravar.

पो *po* (nom. *pauḥ*), fr. Nom. *pāvaya*, Pāṇ. i, 1, 58, Vārtt. 2, Pat.

योगरुद्र *pogaṇḍa*, mfn. not full-grown or adult, young, Pur.; deformed, having a redundant or defective member, L.; m. a boy, one from his 5th to his 16th year, W. (cf. *a-p°*).

Pauganda, mf(ī)n. relating to a boy, boyish, Pur.; n. (also °*daka*) boyhood, a period lasting from the 5th to the 16th year, BhP., Sch.
