

पोञ्च *poñch*, cl. I. *Ā. poñchate*, to clean (shoes), Divyāv. (prob. for *prōñch*, q.v.)

पोट *poṭa*, m. (\sqrt{put} ?) the foundation of a house, L. (cf. *poṭa*); putting together, uniting, mixing, L.; = *sakala* (?), Hcar., Sch.; (*ā*), f. a hermaphrodite or a woman with a beard, Hcar.; a female servant or slave, L.; (*ī*), f. the rectum, PārGṛ., Sch.; a large alligator, L. — **गला**, m. (only L.) a species of reed; *Saccharum Spontaneum*; a fish; = *pañcajanya*.

पोतका, m. a servant, KātyŚr., Sch.; (*ikā*), f. a species of plant, L.

पोतया, Nom. *Ā. yate = potām karoti*, Pāṇ. iii, 1, 17, Vārtt. 1.

पोटल *poṭala* (Car.) and **लका** (KātyŚr., Sch.), m., *°likā* (L.), f. a bundle or packet.

पोट्टाला, n., *°lī*, f. id., L.

पोट्टालका, m. or n. id., Car.

पोट्टालि-√कृ, to put together into a bundle or packet, Car.

पोटिक *poṭika*, m. a pustule, boil, L.

पोट्टिल *poṭṭila*, m. (with Jainas) N. of the ninth Arhat of the future Utsarpiṇī, L.

पोडु *poḍu*, m. the parietal bone, the bone forming the upper part of the skull, L.

पोत *pota*, m. (hardly fr. $\sqrt{pū}$; but cf. Uṇ. iii, 86) a young animal or plant (mostly ifc., e.g. *miriga-p°* 'a y° deer', *cūla-p°* 'a y° mango tree'), MBh.; Kāv. &c.; a fetus which has no enveloping membrane, L.; cloth, a garment, L.; the foundation of a house, L. (cf. *poṭa*); m. n. a vessel, ship, boat, MBh.; Hariv.; Var.; Kāv. [Cf. Lat. *putus*; Lit. *pautas*.] — **जा**, mfn. produced from a fetus which has no enveloping membrane (opp. to *jarāyu-ja*), L. — **त्वा**, n. the state or condition of (being) a ship, Mcar. — **धारा** (Gal.), **°rin** (Śatr.), m. a ship-owner, master of a vessel. — **प्लावा**, m. 'floating in a ship,' a seaman, mariner, Var. — **बाण**, see *vaṇij*. — **भान्गा**, m. shipwreck, Kathās.; Pañc. — **रक्ष**, m. 'ship-governing,' the rudder of a boat, L. — **वाण**, m. 'ship-merchant,' a voyaging merchant, Hit. — **वाहा** (L.), **°haka** (Pañcad.), m. 'boat-conductor,' a boatman, steersman. — **सैलि**, m. small or young rice, L. **पोतच्छदाना**, n. 'cloth-covering,' a tent, L. **पोतधाना**, n. small fry, a shoal of young fish, Vāsav. **पोतब्हा**, m. a species of camphor, Gal. (cf. *potāsa*).

Potaka, m. a young animal or plant (mostly ifc.; cf. *poṭa*), MBh.; Kāv. &c.; N. of a serpent-demon, MBh.; the site or foundation of a house, L. (cf. *grīha-p°*); (*ikā*), f. (only L.) cloth, a garment; *Basella Lucida* or *Rubra*; *Anethum Sowa*; = *mūla-potī*; (*ī*), f. *Turdus Macrourus* or *Basella Lucida*, L.

Potāya, Nom. *Ā. yate*, to be a ship, Siphās.

Potyā, f. = *potānām samūhah*, g. *pāsādi*.

पोतन *potana*, n. N. of a town, HParis.

पोतरक *potaraka*, m. or n. = next, Buddh.

Potala, m. or n. N. of a seaport on the Indus (= *Parāla*; later applied to the residence of the Dalai Lama in Lhassa), Buddh. (cf. MWB. 292 &c.)

Potalaka, m. or n. N. of a mountain (= *potala*?), L.; (*ikā*), f., see *go-potalikā*. — **priya**, m. 'fond of the mountain P°', N. of a Buddha or of a Jina, L.

पोताल *potāla*, m. N. of a Brāhman, L.; w. r. for *potala*.

पोतास *potāsa*, m. a species of camphor, L. (Eng. *potash*?).

पोतिमत्सक *potimatsaka*, m. N. of a prince, MBh. (v.l. *paūtimatsyaka* and *yotimatsaka*).

पोतु *potu*, m. ($\sqrt{I. pū}$) = *mānabhūṇḍa-śodhaka*, L.

Pōtri or **potri**, m. 'Purifier,' N. of one of the 16 officiating priests at a sacrifice (the assistant of the Brāhman; = *yajñasya śodhayitri*, Sāy.), RV.; Br.; ŚrS.; Hariv.; N. of Vishnu, L.; (*tri*), f. N. of Durgā, Gal. (cf. *pautri*). — **त्वा-प्रयोग** or **°tri-prayoga**, m. N. of wk.

Potrā, n. the Soma vessel of the Potri, RV.; the office of the P°, ib.; KātyŚr.; the snout of a hog, Rit.; Hcar.; a ploughshare, L.; a garment or a thunderbolt (= *vastra*, v.l. *vajra*, L.); a ship or boat, L. (cf. *poṭa*). — **माण्डला**, n. 'snout-orb,' the round snout

(of a hog &c.), Rit. **Potrāyudha**, m. armed with a snout, a hog, boar, L.

Potri, in comp. for *°trin*. — **दांशत्रा-जा**, m. a kind of gem (supposed to be produced in the tusk of a boar), L. — **रथा**, f. 'hog-vehicled,' (with Buddhists) N. of Māyā; (with Jainas) N. of a Śakti or female divinity.

Potrin, m. 'snouted,' a wild boar, Vcar.

Potri, f. a garment (?), Divyāv.

Potriya, mfn. relating or belonging to the Potri, AitBr.; KātyŚr.

Ponaka. See *śata-p°*.

Popuva, mfn. (fr. Intens.) purifying much or repeatedly, Pāṇ. i, 1, 4, Sch.

पोष *poṭha*, m. ($\sqrt{puṭh}$) a blow, stroke, R.

Pothakī, f. a kind of ulcer on the eyelids, Suśr. (cf. *poṭika*).

Pothikā. See *ava-p°*.

पोनूरुस्थलमाहात्म्य *ponnūru-sthala-māhātmya*, n. N. of wk.

पोया *pojā*, f. a kind of wind instrument, Kalpas.

पोयालदह *pojāladaha*, m. or n. N. of a tank or pool, Kshītīs.

पोर *pora* = *parvan*, in *nīla-p°* and *śata-p°*, q.v.

Poraka, id. in *śata-p°*.

पोल *pola*, m. (\sqrt{pul}) magnitude, bulk, heap, L. (g. *jvalādi*); (*ī*), f., see next.

Polikā (Bhpr.), *°lī* (L.), a kind of cake (cf. *pūlikā*, *pauli*, *pūpālī*).

पोलिन्द *polinda*, m. the mast or the ribs of a ship or boat, L. (cf. *padāra*, *°raka*, *padālinda*).

पोविय *poviya*, m. N. of the father of Gaṅga-dāsa, Cat.

पोष *pōsha*, m. (\sqrt{push}) thriving, prosperity, abundance, wealth, growth, increase, RV.; AV.; Br.; GṛŚrS.; nourishing, nurture, rearing, maintaining, supporting, Kāv.; Pur. &c. **°shaka**, mfn. (*ikā*) n. nourishing, feeding, a nourisher, supporter, breeder, keeper, Mn.; MBh. &c.; (ifc.) subsisting on or by, Hariv. **°shana**, mfn. nourishing, cherishing (cf. *paksha-p°*); n. the act of nourishing, fostering, keeping, supporting, MBh.; Kāv. &c. **°shaniya**, mfn. to be nourished or kept or protected, MärKP. **°sham**, ind. (with \sqrt{push}) to thrive or prosper in (comp.), Pat.

Poshayitri, mfn. (fr. Caus.) one who nourishes or cherishes or rears, L. **°shayitnū**, mfn. causing to grow or thrive, nourishing, fostering, RV.; m. the Indian cuckoo, L. **°shayishnū**, mfn. causing to thrive, advantageous, beneficial, AV.

Poshas. See *viśvāyu-poshas*.

Poshita, mfn. nourished, cherished, supported, MW. **°shitavya**, mfn. to be cherished or protected, W. **°shitri**, mfn. one who breeds or rears, Kull.

Poshin, mfn. nourishing, rearing, Kathās.

Poshuka, mfn. prospering, growing, ShāḍvBr.

Poshtri, mfn. = *°shitri*, MBh.; Var.; m. grey bonduc, W.; -*vara*, mfn. the best of nourishers, nourishing best, W.

Pōshya, mfn. thriving, well fed, RV.; abundant, copious, ib.; causing wealth or prosperity, AV.; to be nourished or fed or brought up or taken care of, MBh.; Kāv.; Pur.; -*putra* (W.), -*putraka* (Pur.), m. an adopted son; -*putra-karaṇa*, n. adoption, MW.; -*varga*, m. a class of persons or objects to be cherished (as parents, children, guests, and the sacred fire), W. **°shyā-vat**, mfn. causing prosperity, beneficial, RV.

पोषध *poshadha*, m. (with Buddhists) fasting, a fasting day, Lalit.; sacred day, Jātak.; *°dhōtsava*, m. sacred festival, Jātak.; *°dhōshita*, mfn. keeping the fast, Divyāv. **Poshadhika**, mfn. relating to fasting or a f° day (?), L. **Poshadheya**, n. fasting must be observed, Lalit.

पौञ्चलीय *paunscaliya*, mfn. (fr. *puñs-cālī*) belonging or relating to harlots, meretricious; -*vidyā*, f. knowledge concerning h°s, Rājat. **°caleyā**, m. the son of a h°, TBr. **°calya**, n. female incontinency, harlotry, Mn.; Hariv.

पौंसवन *paunsavana*, n. fr. and = *puñsavana*, L. (See p. 630, col. 3.)

पौसायन *paunsaayanā*, m. patr. fr. 2. *puñs*, ŚBr.

Paunsa, mfn. (*ī*) n. worthy of or fit for or relating to a man, manly, human, BhP.; n. manhood, virility, ib.

Paunsa, mfn. belonging to men, manly, Śamk.; n. manhood, virility, manly strength or a manly deed, RV.

पौकस *paukasa*, v.l. for *paukasa*, Brahmu-
Up.

पौगण्ड *pauganda*, *°ḍaka*. See *poganda*.

पौञ्च *pauccha*, mfn. (fr. *puccha*) being on the tail, caudal, Kathās.

पौञ्जिष्ठ *paunjishṭhā*, m. (fr. *puñjishṭha*) a fisherman (v.l. *°shṭa*), AV.; TBr.; patr. (v.l. *paunj°*), Samskarak.

पौटलि *pautali*, m. a patr., Samskarak.

पौटायन *pautāyana*, m. a patr. fr. *puṭa*, g. *āvādi*.

पौड *pauda*. See *pakta-p°*.

पौणकि *paunaki*, m. patr. fr. *puṇaka*, Hcar.

पौणिकि *pauniki*, m., *°kyā*, f. patr. fr. *puṇika*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 79, Sch.

पौणिकेर *paunikera*, m. metron. (fr.?), Pat.

पौण्डरीक *paundarika*, mfn. (*ī*) n. (fr. *puṇḍarika*) made or consisting of lotus-flowers (as a garland), Mālatīm.; m. a kind of Soma sacrifice lasting 11 days, ShāḍvBr.; ŚrS. &c.; patr. of Kshema-dhṛitvan, TāṇḍBr.; n. (sc. *kushṭha*) a kind of leprosy, Suśr. — **कारिक**, f., -**क्लिप्ति-प्रयोग**, m., -**दासा-दिवसा-पद्धति**, f., -**पद्धति**, f., -**प्रयोग**, m., -**रात्नकर**, m., -**समान**, n.pl., -**होत्रि-सप्तका**, n., -**होत्रा-प्रयोग**, m. N. of wks.

पौण्डरीय *paundariya*, *°riyaka* and *°rya*, n. a kind of drug used as a remedy for diseased eyes (= *puṇḍarya*), L.

पौण्ड 1. *paundra*, m. (fr. *puṇḍra*) a species of sugar-cane of a pale straw colour, Suśr.; (pl.) N. of a people and of a country (said to include part of South Behar and Bengal), MBh.; Hariv.; Pur.; (sg.) a king of this country (regarded as a son of Vasudeva), ib.; N. of the conch-shell of Bhīma, MBh.; n. a sectarian mark, KātyŚr., Sch. — **राजा**, m. a king of the Paundras, Kathās. — **विशया**, m. the country of the P°s, ib.

2. **Paundra**, Vṛiddhi form of *puṇḍra* in comp. — **नागरा**, mfn., Pāṇ. vii, 3, 24, Sch. — **मत्स्यका**, m. N. of a prince, MBh. — **वत्सा**, m. N. of a Vedic school, L. (v.l. -*vaccha*). — **वर्धना**, n. N. of a city (= *puṇḍra-v°*), R.; Kathās. (also -*vivardhana*, Uṇ. ii, 13, Sch.); m. N. of a country (Behar), L.

Paundraka, m. the pale straw-coloured species of sugar-cane, Bhpr.; a prince or (pl.) the people of the Paundras, Mn.; MBh.; Hariv.; Pur.; N. of a partic. mixed caste of hereditary sugar-boilers (the son of a Vaiśya by a woman of the distiller class, regarded as one of the degraded races of Kshatriyas), Mn. x, 44; n. (as mfn. ifc.) a sectarian mark, BhP.

Paundrika, m. a species of sugar-cane, L.; pl. N. of a people, MBh.

पौण्ड्र *paundhra*, w. r. for *paundra*.

पौण्य *paunya*, mfn. (fr. *puṇya*) acting rightly, virtuous, worthy, TāṇḍBr.; KātyŚr.

पौतक्रत *pautakratā*, m. metron. fr. *pūta-kratā*, RV.

पौतन *pautana*, m. (fr. *pūtanā*?) N. of a country or people, Suśr. (Sch. = *mathurā-pradeśa*).

Pautanya, n. (fr. *pūtanā*), Pat.

पौतरीय *pautariya*, mfn. (fr. *pūlara*), Gaṇ.

पौतव *pautava*, n. a kind of measure, L. (cf. *potu*).

पौति *pauti*, Vṛiddhi form of *pūti* in comp. — **नासिक्या**, n. fetor of the nostrils, Mn. xi, 50. — **माशा**, mfn. (fr. -*māshya*), g. *kaṇvādi*. — **माश्या**, m. (g. *gargādi*) patr. or metron. of a teacher, BrĀrUp. (also *°shī-putra*); (*ā*), f., Pāṇ. iv, 1, 74, Vārtt. 1, Pat. — **माश्यायणा** (*pauti-*), m. patr. fr. prec., ŚBr.; (*ī*), f., Pat.
