भृग् bhrigu, m. pl. (√bhrāj) N. of a mythical race of beings (closely connected with fire, which they find [RV. x, 46, 2] and bring to men [i, 58, 6; 195, 2] or enclose in wood [vi, 15, 2] or put in the navel of the world [i, 143, 4]; or which is brought to them and first kindled by Mātri-śvan [i, 60, 1; iii, 5, 10]; they are also said to fabricate chariots [iv, 16, 20] and are mentioned together with the Aṅgirasas, Atharvans, Ribhus, Maruts, Druhyus &c. [cf. Naigh. v, 5]; in Hcat. 12 Bhrigus are enumerated among gods; cf. Gk. οί Φλεγύαι), RV.; AV.; ŠBr.; Kauś.; N. of one of the chief Brāhmaṇical families (to which the Aitāśayanas are said to belong, RV. (esp. vii, 18, 6; viii, 3, 9 &c.); Br.; MBh.; Pur.; sg. N. of a Rishi regarded as the ancestor of the Bhrigus, AV.; AitBr. (he has the patr. Vāruṇi and is the supposed author of RV. ix, 65; x, 19; he is enumerated among the 10 Maharsis created by the first Manu, Mn. i, 35; cf. Bhrīngāya, Nom. A. °yate, to behave like a bee, Kusum.

Bhrīngāra, m. n. (said to be fr. √bhrī) a golden pitcher or vase, MBh.; Hariv.; Kām. &c.; a vase used at the inauguration of a king (of 8 different substances and 8 different forms), L.; m. = bhrīngārāja, L.; (ī), f. a cricket, L.; n. cloves; gold, L.

Bhrīngāraka, m. a pitcher or vase (= bhrīngārā), Daś. ḷīkā, f. = bhrīngārī, a cricket, L. ḷītī, m. = bhrīngarītī (see bhrīngarītī), L. ḷīru, m. = bhrīngāra, a pitcher or vase, Hariv.

Bhrīngī, m. N. of one of Śiva's attendants (cf. next), VāmP.; RTL. 441.

Bhrīngin, m. the Indian fig-tree, L.; N. of one of Śiva's attendants (cf. bhrīngarītī, ḷītī &c.), Kathās.; pl. N. of a people, Var.; (ītī), f. a species of tree, L. Bhrīngīśā, m. 'lord of the Bhrīngins,' N. of Śiva, Cat.

Bhrīngarītī or ḷītī (Hariv.; Bālar.), ḷītī (L.), ḷītī (Hariv.), ḷītī (L.), m. = bhrīngārītī, q. v.; ḷītī (Hariv. 15421?) or ḷītī (ib. iii, 104, 15), du. N. of two of Śiva's attendants.

भृश् bhrīj (cf. √bhrājj), cl. I. Ā. bharjate (pf. babhrīje: Caus. bharjayati; aor. ababharjat and abibhrījat: Desid. bibharjishate: Intens. baribhrījate; baribharkti and barbhārkti, Gr.), to fry, parch, Dhātup. vi, 17.

Bharjana, mfn. parching i.e. destroying, annihilating, frustrating (with gen.), BhP.; n. the act of roasting or frying, Kātyāśr.; a frying-pan, ib., Sch.

Bharjita, mfn. (fr. Caus.) roasted, fried, Suśr.; destroyed, annihilated, BhP.

Bhrīkta, mfn. roasted, fried, L.

भृजायन् bhrījāyana, m. patr., Saṃskārak.

भृश् bhrījj, bhrījja, bhrījana. See under √bhrājj.

भृश् bhrīd, cl. 6. P. bhrīdati, to dive, plunge, Dhātup. xxviii, 100 (v.l. for krud).

भृणीय bhrīṇīya, Nom. Ā. °yāte, to be angry (= krudhyate), Naigh. ii, 12 (cf. √bhrī and bhrīṇīya).

भृषिट्का bhrīṇītikā, f. a species of plant, L. (prob. = bhrīṇītikā, q. v.)

भृषित् bhrīṇīdi, a wave, L. (cf. bhrīṇīdi).

भृश् bhrīta, bhrītya &c. See p. 764.

भृश् bhrīmā, m. (√bhrām) error, mistake, RV.

Bhrīmalā, mfn. stunned, torpid, AV.

Bhrīmī, mfn. whirling round, restless, active, quick, RV. i, 31, 16 &c.; m. a whirlwind, hurricane, ib. ii, 34, 1 ('a moving cloud' or 'a kind of lute,' Sāy.); a whirlpool, eddy, L.; (bhrīmī), f. quickness, activity, ib. iii, 62, 1.

Bhrīmy-aśva, m. 'having quick horses,' N. of a man, Nir. ix, 24.

भृश् bhrīś, cl. 4. P. bhrīsyati, to fall, fall down, Dhātup. xxvi, 115 (cf. √bhrāns, bhrās, of which √bhrīś is only the weak form); cl. 6. P. bhrīsatī, to be strong or vehement, Vop. (rather Nom. fr. next).

Bhrīśa, mfn. (perhaps the original meaning may be 'falling heavily,' cf. √bhrās) strong, vehement, mighty, powerful, frequent, abundant (often ibc., cf. below; rarely as an independent word; cf. su-bhrīśa), Mn.; MBh. &c.; ibc. and (am), ind. strongly, violently, vehemently, excessively, greatly, very much, Mn.; MBh. &c.; harshly, severely, ChUp.; quickly, without hesitation, MBh.; often, frequently, R.; eminently, in a superior manner, L.; m. a partic. tutelary deity, VarBr. — kopana, mfn. extremely
