मामिदि *māmiḍi*, m. N. of a man, Cat.

मामुखी *māmukhī*, f. N. of a Buddhist Devī, W. (cf. *māmaki*).

मामुदगजनवी *māmuda-gajanavī*, m. = **مُحَمْدٌ** **غَزِّي** Mahmūd of Ghaznī, Kshitiṣ.

माय *māya*, mfn. ($\sqrt{3}$. *mā*) measuring (see *dhānya-m^o*); creating illusions (said of Vishṇu), MBh.; (*ā*), f., see below. — **दासा** (?), m. N. of an author, Cat. — **वत्**, mfn. (comp. *māyā-vattara*) m.c. for *māyā-vat*, Br.

माया, f. art, wisdom, extraordinary or supernatural power (only in the earlier language); illusion, unreality, deception, fraud, trick, sorcery, witchcraft, magic, RV. &c. &c.; an unreal or illusory image, phantom, apparition, ib. (esp. ibc. = false, unreal, illusory; cf. comp.); duplicity (with Buddhists one of the 24 minor evil passions), Dharmas. 69; (in phil.) Illusion (identified in the Sāṃkhya with Prakṛiti or Pradhāna and in that system, as well as in the Vedānta, regarded as the source of the visible universe), IW. 83; 108; (with Śaivas) one of the 4 Pāśas or snares which entangle the soul, Sarvad.; MW.; (with Vaishṇavas) one of the 9 Śaktis or energies of Vishṇu, L.; Illusion personified (sometimes identified with Durgā, sometimes regarded as a daughter of Anṛita and Nirṛiti or Nikṛiti and mother of Mrityu, or as a daughter of Adharma), Pur.; compassion, sympathy, L.; Convolvulus Turpethum, L.; N. of the mother of Gautama Buddha, MWB. 24; of Lakshmi, W.; of a city, Cat.; of 2 metres, Col.; du. — **त्माका** (*māyātām^o*), mf(*ikā*).n. consisting of illusion, essentially illusory, W. — **दा**, m. ‘giving or causing illusion,’ an alligator, crocodile, L. — **दर्शना**, n. N. of ch. of BhavP. — **देवी**, f. N. of the mother of Gautama Buddha, Buddh.; of the wife of Pradyumna, VP.; — **सुता**, m. ‘son of Māyā-devī,’ N. of Gautama Buddha, L. — **धरा**, mfn. possessing illusion, skilled in magic, R.; m. N. of a king of the Asuras, Kathās. — **धिका** (*māyādh^o*), mfn. abounding in magic, R. — **न्विता** (*māyānv^o*), mfn. possessing ill^o, deceitful, MW. — **पातु**, mfn. skilled in ill^o or magical arts, Var. — **पति**, m. ‘lord of ill^o,’ N. of Vishṇu, Pañcar. — **पुर**, f. N. of a city, Kathās. (cf. *māyā*). — **पुरि**, f. = prec., ib.; — **महात्म्या**, n. N. of sev. wks. — **प्रयोगा**, m. the application or employment of magic, Pañcat.; deceitfulness, A. — **फला**, n. a gall-nut, L. — **बाटु**, m. N. of a king of the Śabaras, Kathās. — **बालवत्**, mfn. one who possesses or makes over to another the virtue of a partic. spell, R. — **बिजाकल्पा**, m. N. of wk. — **भ्युदयाना** (*māyābh^o*), m. N. of a Kāyastha, Rājat. — **मता**, m. or n. (?) N. of wk. — **माया**, mf(*ī*).n. consisting of illusion, formed of or creating ill^o, illusive, unreal, magical, Up.; MBh.; R. &c.; m. N. of a Rākshasa, Bālar. — **मानवाका**, mfn. appearing in an illusory way as a boy or dwarf, BhP. — **महात्म्या**, n. N. of ch. of SkandaP. — **मृगा**, m. an illusory antelope, phantom deer, R. — **मोहा**, m. ‘illusion, bewilderment,’ N. of a Jina or Buddha, VP. — **यन्त्रा**, n. ‘instrument of illusion,’ enchantment (ibc. = enchanted, magical, e.g. *tra-vimāna*, m. n. an enc^o chariot, magical car), Kathās. — **योगा**, m. the application or employment of illusion, empl^o of magical arts, R.; BhP. — **योधिन**, mfn. fighting illusively or with deceitful artifices, MBh. — **रति**, f. N. of the wife of Pradyumna (= *-devī*), VP. — **रसिका**, mfn. see *-vasika*. — **रावणा**, m. Rāvana in an illusory or disguised form, Cat. — **लिलामता**, m. or n. (?) N. of wk. — **वाचना**, n. a deceptive or hypocritical speech, Pañcat. — **वत्** (*māyā-*), mfn. having magical powers, employing deceit, sly, cunning, RV.; R.; Bālar. (-*tara*, AitBr.; more correctly *māyā-vat*—

tara, ŠBr.); connected with many magical arts, BhP., Sch.; m. N. of Kansa, L.; (*atī*), f. a partic. magical art personified, Kathās.; N. of the wife of Pradyumna, Hariv.; Pur. (cf. *-devī*); of the wife of a Vidyā-dhara, Kathās.; of a princess, ib.; of an authoress of certain magical incantations, Cat. — **वानि** (*māyāv^o*), m. मायिका, mfn. illusory, creating illusion, Pañcar.; practising deceit, deceiving others, L.; m. a conjurer, juggler, L.; n. or (*ā*), f. a gall-nut, L. — **भैरवा**, n. N. of a Tantra.

मायिन्, mfn. artful, skilled in art or enchantment, cunning, deceptive, illusory (*yi-tā*, f.), RV.; AV.; ŠvetUp. &c.; subject to illusion, BhP.; m. a conjurer, juggler, magician, Kathās.; a cheat, deceiver, W.; N. of Brahmā, L.; of Śiva, L.; of Agni, L.; of Kāma, L.; n. magic, magical art, BhP. (cf. *durm^o*); a gall-nut, L.

मायिया, mfn. proceeding from Māyā, Harav.

मायेया, mfn. (fr. *māyā*), g. *nadyādi*.

मायणा *māyāṇa*, m. N. of the father of Mādhava and Sāyaṇa, Cat.

मायवा *māyavā*, m. a descendant of Mayu or Māyu, RV.

मायाति *māyāti* (?), m. = *nara-bali*, BrahmayP.

मायु 2. *māyu*, m. ($\sqrt{3}$. *mā*; for 1. *māyū* see p. 804, col. 2) = *āditya*, Nir.; sorcery, witchcraft, bad art (cf. *dur-m^o*); (*ū*), AV. xviii, 4, 4.

मायु 3. *māyu*, m. n. (accord. to Uṇ. i, I fr. ✓ 1. *mi*) gall, bile, the bilious humour, L.

मायुका *māyuka*, mfn. = *hrasva*, Naigh. (cf. *pra-māyu*, *yuka*, under *pra-√mi*).

मायुराज *māyurāja*, m. N. of a son of Kuvera, L. (cf. *mayu-r^o*); of a poet (also read *māyū-r^o*), Cat.

मायुस् *māyus*, m. N. of a son of Purū-ravas, VP.

मायुका *māyuka*. See under 1. *māyū*, p. 804, col. 2.

मायुर *māyūra*, mf(*ī*).n. (fr. *mayūra*) belonging to or coming from a peacock, MBh.; R. &c.; made of p^os feathers, VarBrS.; drawn by p^os, Hariv.; dear to p^os, Mālav.; (*ī*), f. a species of plant, L.; (in music) a partic. Rāgiṇī, Samgīt.; a partic. ster-nutatory, Car.; a flock of peacocks, Pāṇ. iv, 2, 44, Sch. — **कर्णा**, m. patr. fr. *mayūra-k^o*, g. *śivādī*. — **कल्पा**, m. N. of a partic. Kalpa or long period of time, Cat. — **व्रतिन्**, m. a member of a partic. sect, L.

मायुराका, m. a peacock-catcher or one who makes various articles with p^os feathers, R.; (*ikā*), f. (in music) a partic. Rāgiṇī, Samgīt.

मायुरि, m. patr. fr. *mayūra*, Pat.

मायुरिका, m. a peacock-catcher, R.

मायोभव *māyobhava* or *vya*, n. (fr. *mayobhū*) well-being, gladness, enjoyment, GrS.

माय्या *māyya*. See *puru-māyya*.

मारिष *mārisha*.

मार *māra*, mfn. (*√mṛi*) killing, destroying; m. death, pestilence, VarBrS.; AVParīś.; slaying, killing, Rājat. (cf. *pasu-m^o*); an obstacle, hindrance, Vās.; the passion of love, god of love, Hariv.; Kāv.; Kathās.; (with Buddhists) the Destroyer, Evil One

(who tempts men to indulge their passions and is the great enemy of the Buddha and his religion; four Māras are enumerated in Dharmas. 80, viz. *skandha*, *kleśa*, *devaputra*, and *mṛityu-m^o*; but the later Buddhist theory of races of gods led to the figment of millions of Māras ruled over by a chief Māra), MWB. 208 &c.; the thorn-apple, L.; (*ī*), f. killing, slaughter, Prasannar.; pestilence (also personified as the goddess of death and identified with Durgā), AVParīś.; Kathās.; Pur. — **कायिका**, mfn. belonging to the retinue or attendants of Māra, Lalit.

कित्ता, f. N. of a Buddhist deity, Kālac. — **जित्**, m. ‘conqueror of Māra,’ N. of Buddha, L. — **दा**, n. ‘death-giving,’ flesh, Gal.; *दद्कारा*, m. N. of a man, Cat. — **पा**, m. ‘death-drinking?’ N. of a man, Cat. — **पापियास**, m. the evil tempter, i.e. Māra, Lalit. — **पुत्रा**, m. a son of the Tempter, i.e. a tempter, ib. — **पी** (?), f. (in music). a partic. Rāgiṇī, Samgīt. — **बिजा**, n. N. of a magical formula, Pañcat. — **मोहिता**, mfn. infatuated by the god of love, Kathās. — **रिपु**, m. ‘enemy of the god of love,’ N. of Śiva, Prasannar. — **वत्**, mfn. full of love, enamoured, Nalōd. — **सिंहा**, m. N. of a prince, VP.

हाति, **हात्ता**, or **हाथी** (?), f. (in music) a partic. Rāgiṇī, Samgīt. — **मारांका**, mfn. displaying tokens of passion, Git. — **मारात्मका**, mfn. naturally murderous, Hit. — **माराभिबु**, m. ‘overthrower of M^o,’ N. of a Buddha, L. — **माराभिरामा**, mfn. fond of destroying, murderous, Dāś. — **मारारी**, m. = *māra-ripu*, Kathās.

माराका, mfn. (ifc. f. *ā*), killing a killer, murderer (cf. *tri-* and *daśa-mārikā*); calcining (cf. *loha-māraka*); m. any deadly disease, plague, pestilence (personified as the god of death), Samk.; a falcon, hawk, L.; (also n.) death of all creatures at the dissolution of the universe, L.; (*ikā*), f. a plague, pestilence, BhP.

माराणा, n. killing, slaying, slaughter, death, destruction, MaitrS.; Mn.; Hariv. &c. (*्यम् प्राव॒ अप्*, to suffer death); a magical ceremony having for its object the destruction of an enemy (also *-karman* and *-kritya*, n.), RāmatUp.; Pañcar.; (scil. *astra*) ‘slayer,’ N. of a partic. mystical weapon, R.; calcination, Cat.; a kind of poison (cf. *māraṇa*); (*ī*), f. ‘slayer,’ N. of one of the 9 Samidhs, Gṛihyas.

मारि, f. death, pestilence, L. (also = *māraka*, m. n.); small-pox, L.; killing, slaying, L.; rain, L. — **व्यासना-वारका**, m. ‘averting plague and distress,’ N. of Kumāra-pāla, L.

मारिता, mfn. (fr. Caus.) killed, slain, destroyed, MārkP.; Pañcat.

मारिन, mfn. (only ifc.) dying (cf. *pūrvा-* and *yuva-m^o*); killing, destroying (cf. *jantu-m^o*).

मारि-मृता, (prob. m.) a spectre, apparition, VarBrS.

मारिया, mfn. belonging to the god of love, Kathās.

मारुका, mf(*ā*).n. dying, perishing, TS.; MānGr.; m. pl. N. of a people, VP.

मारका *mārakata*, mf(*ī*).n. (fr. *marakata*) belonging to an emerald, having any of the properties or qualities of an e^o, coloured like an e^o, MBh.; Kāv.; Pur.; m. (with *dhātu*) an emerald, MBh. — **त्वा**, n. state or colour of an emerald, L.

मारजातक *mārajātaka*, m. a cat (?), W.

मारवा *mārava*, mf(*ī*).n. (fr. *maru*) relating to a wilderness, forming a w^o, being in a w^o, Nalōd.; (*ī*), f. N. of a partic. musical scale, Col.

माराविक *mārāvika* or *mārā*
