*Saiva* 1. *saiva*, mf(ā)n. (fr. *śiva*) relating or belonging or sacred to the god Śiva, coming or derived from Śiva, R.; Kathās.; Pur. &c.; m. patr. fr. *śiva*, Pāp. iv, 1, 112; 'a worshipper or follower of Śiva,' N. of one of the three great divisions of modern Hindūism (the other two being the Vaishnavas and Śaktas, qq.vv.) the Śaivas identify Śiva—rather than Brahṁā and Viṣṇu—with the Supreme Being and are exclusively devoted to his worship, regarding him as the source and essence of the universe as well as its disintegrator and destroyer; the temples dedicated to him in his reproducing and vivifying character [as denoted by the Liṅga, q.v.] are scattered all over India; the various sects of Śaivas are described in RTL. 86 &c.; a particular religious rite in honour of Durgā (consisting of devout meditation and prostration of the body), MW.; the thorn-apple, L.; a kind of plant (= *vasuka*), L.; (with Jainas), N. of the fifth black Vāsudeva, L.; (ē), f. N. of the goddess Mānāsā, Cat.; n. auspiciousness, welfare, prosperity, BhP.; N. of a Śāstra and of a Tantra and of a Purāṇa (see below). — *kalpadruma*, m. N. of a wk. by Appaya Dikshita. — *tattva-prakāśa*, m., — *tattvāmṛita*, n., — *tantra*, n. N. of wks. — *tā*, f. devotion to or worship of Śiva, Rājat. — *tātparya-samgraha*, m. *Saivava* *saivava*, mfn. (fr. *śiśu*) childish, Viddh.; m. a patr., Prav.; (pl.) N. of a people, MBh.; n. childhood, infancy, pupilage, the period under age (i.e. under sixteen), Mn.; MBh. &c.; childishness, stupidity, Prasannar.; N. of various Sāmans, ĀrshBr. — *yauvaniya*, mfn. representing childhood and youth, Naish.

*Saisavya*, n. childhood, infancy, Sarvad. (prob. w.r. for *saisava*).

*Saisika* *saisika*, m. pl. N. of a people, VP.

*Saisira* *saisira*, mf(ā)n. (see *śisira*) relating or belonging to the Śisira or cool season, AV. &c. &c.; composed by Śisira, Cat.; m. N. of a teacher and founder of a supposed Śākhā of the Ṛig-veda, ib.; of a mountain, MBh.; of a dark kind of Cātaka bird, L. — *śākhā*, f. N. of a Śākhā of the Ṛig-veda, (perhaps only a subdivision of the Śākala), Cat. *Saisirāstra*, mfn. having cold weapons (as the moon in fighting with the Daityas), Hariv. (v. l. *śisirāstra*).

*Saisirāyana*, m. patr. fr. *śisira*, Hariv. (v. l. *śisirāyana*).

*Saisiri*, m. (patr. fr. id.) N. of a teacher of the White Yajur-veda, ĀśvŚr.

*Saisirika*, mfn. one who studies or knows Śisira, g. *vasantādi*.

*Saisiriya*, mfn. relating or belonging to Śaisiri, g. *gahādi* (accord. to some 'to be performed in the cool season') N. of one of the seven Śākala texts, Cat. — *śākhā*, f. a subordinate branch of the Śākala-śākhā, ib.

*Saisiriyaka*, mfn. = *saisiriya*, ib.

*Saisireya*, m. patr. of a teacher, ib.

*Saisunāga* *saisunāga*, m. patr. fr. *śiśu-nāga*; (pl.) Śisunāga and his descendants, VP.

*Saisunāri* (Hcar.) and *Saisunāli* (Vās., Introd.), m. (prob.) w.r. for *saisupālī*.

*Saisupāla* or *Saisupāli*, m. patr. fr. *śiśu-pāla*, MBh.

*Saisumāra*, mfn. relating or belonging to Śisumāra, BhP.

*Saisnya* *saisnya*, m. (fr. *śiśna*; scil. *bhoga*) sexual enjoyment, BhP.

*Saisha* *saisha*, m. (? for *saisa*; see *saisira* above) the cool season, L.

*Saishika* *saishika*, mf(ā)n. (fr. *śesha*) relating to the remainder, holding good in the remaining cases (but only now and not in previous cases), Kār. on Pāp.; Śis., Sch. &c.; (ē), f. (with *shashthī*) the genitive case taught in Pāp. ii, 3, 50 (in the rule *shashthī śeshe*), Nyāyas., Sch.

*Saishiri* *saishiri*, w.r. for *saisiri* (q.v.)
