**Sodhin**, mfn. cleansing, purifying, Su०r.; requiting, settling, ib.

**Sodhya**, mfn. to be cleansed or purified or refined or corrected or improved, Mn.; Yājñ. &c.; to be discharged, payable, due, W.; to be subtracted, VarBrS., Sch.; m. an accused person, one to be tried or cleared, W.; n. (in arith.) a constant number to be subtracted, ib.

**शोनाय** *sonāya*, *sonita*, incorrect for *sonāya*, *nīta*.

**शोफ** *sopha*, m. (connected with  $\sqrt{s}vi$ ; ifc. f.  $\bar{a}$ ; cf. *sotha*) intumescence, morbid swelling, tumour, Su०r.; Kathās. — **ghnī**, f. 'removing swellings,' Desmodium Gangeticum, L.; a Punar-nava with red flowers, L. — **nāśana**, m. id., a kind of plant (= *nīla*), L.; ( $\bar{i}$ ), f. Boerhavia Procumbens, L. — **hārin**, m. id., Ocimum Pilosum, L. — **hṛit**, m. id., Semecarpus Anacardium, L. **Sophāri**, m. 'enemy of swellings,' a kind of bulbous plant, L.

**Sophita**, mfn. afflicted with tumours or swellings, Bhadrab.

**Sophin**, mfn. having tumours, subject to swellings, id., Car.

**शोभ** *sobha*, mfn. (fr.  $\sqrt{s}ubh$ ) bright, brilliant, handsome, W.; m. N. of a man, Rājat.; (pl.) of a class of gods, L.; of a class of heretics, L.; lustre (in comp. for *sobhā*, q. v.) — **kṛit**, m. causing lustre, beautifying, W.; the 36th (or 37th) year of Jupiter's cycle of 60 years (cf. *subha-kṛit*), VarBrS.; w. r. for *sotha-kṛit*, L. — **jāta**, m. 'lustre-born,' N. of a prince, Buddh.

**Sobhaka**, mf(*ikā*)n. brilliant, beautiful, Naish.; m. N. of a man, Rājat.

**Sobhātha**, m. splendour, SV.

**Sobhanā**, mf( $\bar{a}$  or  $\bar{i}$ )n. brilliant, splendid, beautiful (at end of comp. = 'beautiful by reason of'), ŠBr.; Kaus.; MBh. &c.; excellent, glorious, magnificent, distinguished in or by (instr. or comp.), MBh.; Kāv. &c.; (ifc.) superior to, better than, BhP.; propitious, auspicious, VarBrS.; Rājat.; virtuous, moral (see comp.); correct, right, Sarvad.; m. N. of Agni at the Śūngā-karman, Gṛihyas.; of Śiva, MBh.; a burnt offering for auspicious results, W.; the fifth of the astron. Yogas, L.; a planet, L.; the eleventh year of Jupiter's cycle, MW.; ( $\bar{a}$ ), f. a beautiful woman (often in voc.), MBh.; Kāv. &c.; turmeric, L.; the yellow pigment Go-rocanā, L.; N. of one of the Mātṛis attending on Skanda, MBh.; (*am*), n. the act of adorning, causing to look beautiful, MW.; an ornament (see *karṇa-s<sup>o</sup>*); anything propitious or auspicious, welfare, prosperity, R.; Pur.; moral good, virtue, ib.; brilliance, MW.; a lotus, L.; tin, L.; (with *Kaśyapasya*) N. of a Sāman, ĀrshBr. — **vatī**, f. **Sobhaniya**, mfn. to be beautified or adorned, MW.; beautiful, splendid, Kāraṇḍ.

**Sobhayitri**, mfn. adorning, beautifying, Nir.

**Sobhāse**, Ved. inf. of  $\sqrt{s}ubh$ , q. v.

**Sobhā**, f. (ifc. f.  $\bar{a}$ ) splendour, brilliance, lustre, beauty, grace, loveliness (*kā sobhā* with loc., 'what beauty is there [in that]', i.e. 'it has no beauty'; *sobhām na  $\sqrt{k}ri$* , 'to look bad or ugly'; ifc. often = 'splendid,' 'excellent,' e.g. *saurya-sobhā*, 'splendid heroism'; *karma-sobhā*, 'a masterpiece'), TS. &c. &c.; distinguished merit, W.; colour, hue, VarBrS.; Mudr.; wish, desire, L.; a kind of metre, Col.; turmeric, L.; the yellow pigment Go-rocanā, L. — **kara**, mfn. causing lustre, beautifying, MBh.; -bhāṭṭa and -mitra, m. N. of two authors, Cat. — *ñjana* or *ñaka* (*sobhāñj<sup>o</sup>*), m. Moringa Pterygosperma (its leaves, flowers and root are edible and are used medicinally, = *sigru*, q. v.), MBh.; Su०r.; Bhpr. — **maya**, mf( $\bar{i}$ )n. full of lustre or beauty, beautiful, MW. — **vatī**, f. a kind

of metre, Col.; N. of a town (cf. *sobhana-vati*), Kathās. — **sinha**, m. N. of a king, Kshitiś.

**Sobhāka**, m. N. of a poet, Cat.

**Sobhāya**, Nom. Ā.  $\circ$ yate, to represent the beauty of anything, Nalac.

**Sobhita**, mfn. (mostly ifc.) splendid, beautiful, adorned or embellished by, MBh.; Kāv. &c.

**Sobhin**, mfn. brilliant, splendid, beautiful, MBh.; (ifc.) resplendent with, beautified by, MBh.; Kāv. &c. (also for *sobha* = *sobhā*; e.g. *anumeya-sobhin*, 'whose splendour may be inferred from,' Kum. i, 37).

**Sobhishtha**, mfn. most brilliant or splendid, RV.

**Sobhuśubha** or **saubhuśubha**, mfn. shining intensely or repeatedly, Unādi-vṛ. 19.

**śosubhyamāna**, mfn. (fr. Intens. of  $\sqrt{s}ubh$ ) shining very much, very brilliant, MBh.

**शोम** *som*, ind. an exclamation interposed in reciting sacred texts (cf. *sōṣ*, *sōṣāmos*, *śoson-sāvas*), TUp.

**शोली** *solī*, f. yellow turmeric, L.

**शोशुचत्** *sōsucat*, mfn. (fr. Intens. of  $\sqrt{s}uc$ ) shining very brightly, very splendid, RV.

**Sōsucāna**, mfn. id., ib.

**Sōsucyamāna**, mfn. sorrowing intensely, grieving deeply, Bhatt.

**शोशोंसावस्** *śoson-sāvas*. See  $\sqrt{s}ans$ , *sōṣ*.

**शोष** I. *sosha*, mfn. (fr.  $\sqrt{s}ush$ ) drying up, desiccating (also fig. = 'removing, destroying'), BhP.; m. the act of drying up, desiccation, dryness, MBh.; Su०r.; pulmonary consumption (also personified as an evil demon), Su०r.; VarBrS.; Hcat.; (also w. r. for *sotha* or *sopha*). — **sambhava**, m. the root of long pepper, L. **Soshāpahā**, f. 'removing consumption,' a kind of plant (= *klītanaka*), L.

**Soshaka**, mfn. drying up, absorbing, removing, destroying, BhP.

**Soshana**, mf( $\bar{i}$ )n. drying up, draining, parching, withering Nir.; MBh.; Su०r.; (ifc.) removing, destroying, BhP.; m. N. of an Agni, Hariv.; of one of the arrows of Kāma-deva (god of love), Vet.; Git., Sch.; Bignonia Indica, L.; n. drying up (intr.), desiccation, MaitrUp.; VarBrS.; making dry, draining, suction, MBh.; Pañcat.; Su०r.; dry ginger, L.

**Soshanīya**, mfn. to be dried or sucked up or drained or absorbed, VarBrS.

**Soshayitavya**, mfn. to be dried up &c., MW.

**Soshayitri**, m. one who dries up or parches, Sāy.

**Soshita**, mfn. dried or sucked up, drained, desiccated, absorbed, exhausted, emptied, Hariv.; Kāv. &c. — **saras**, mfn. possessing dried-up ponds, drying up ponds (as summer), Pañcat.

**Soshin**, mfn. drying up (intr.), wasting away, consumptive, Su०r.; VarBrS.; (mostly ifc.) drying up (trans.), frying, desiccating, absorbing, exhausting, MBh.; R.; Su०r.; (*inī*), f. ether (one of the five Dhāraṇās), Cat.

**Soshu**, m. drought, thirst, L.

**Soshya**. See *a-soshya*.

**शोष** 2. *sōsha*, m. (fr.  $\sqrt{s}ū = \bar{v}i$ ; cf. *sūsha*) breath, vital energy, VS. (Mahādh.)

**शोष्णी** *soshyanī*, (prob.) w. r. for *soshyanī*, ĀpGr.

**शोस** *sos*(?), ind. a particle of reproach or contempt, L.

**शोक** *sauka*, n. (fr. *suka*) a flight of parrots, g. *khaṇḍiklādi*; a kind of coitus, L.; sorrowfulness (perhaps w. r. for *soka*), L.

**Sauki**, m. a patr., Pravar.

**Saukeya**, m. patr. fr. *suka*, g. *śubhrāddi*.

**शोकर** *saukara*, *orava*. See *sauk*.

**शोक** I. *śaukta*, mfn. (fr. *sukta*) acid, acetic, acetous, W.

I. **Śauktika**, mfn. id., ib.; relating to sour gruel, Car.

**शोक** 2. *śaukta*, mfn. (fr. *sukti*) made of mother-of-pearl, Hcat.; n. N. of various Sāmans, ĀrshBr.

**Saukrāyā**, m. patr. fr. *śukra* (also pl.), Samskārak.

**Saukri**, mfn., g. *sutamgamāddi*.

**Saukreya**, m. patr. fr. *śukra*, g. *śubhrāddi*; (pl.) N. of a warrior-tribe, Pāṇ. v, 3, 117; (sg.) a king of the Saukreyas, ib. iv, 1, 178, Sch.

**Saukrya**, n. (fr. *śukra*), g. *śridhāddi*.

**शौक्र** *śaukla*, mfn. (fr. *śukla*) relating to what is clean or pure or undefiled (with *janman*, n. 'birth from pure or blameless parents'), BhP.; n. N. of a Sāman (w. r. for 2. *śaukta*).

**Sauklya**, n. whiteness, brightness, clearness, VarBrS.; Vedāntas.

**शौक्रिक्य** *śauklikeya*, m. a sort of poison, L. (prob. w. r. for *śauklikeya*, q. v.)

**शौक्ष** *śauṅga*, m. (patr. fr. *śuṅga*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 117) N. of various men (pl. of a Gotra), Āśvār.; Vās., Introd.; ( $\bar{a}$  and  $\bar{i}$ ), f., see below.

**Śauṅgāyani** and **Śauṅgi**, m. patr. fr. *śuṅga*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 117; 2, 138, &c.

**Śauṅgī-pūtra**, m. N. of a teacher, ŠBr.

**Śauṅgiya**, mfn. (fr. *śuṅgi*), g. *gahāddi*.

**Śauṅgeyā**, m. (metron. fr. *śuṅgā*) N. of Garuda, Suparn.; a falcon or hawk, Daś.

**Śauṅgya**, m. patr. fr. *śuṅga*, Pravar.

**शौच** *śaucā*, m. (fr. *śuci*) N. of a man (also called Āhneya), TĀr.; n. cleanliness, purity, purification (esp. from defilement caused by the death of a relation), Āśvār.; Mn.; MBh. &c.; purity of mind, integrity, honesty (esp. in money-matters), MBh.; R. &c.; (with Buddhists) self-purification (both external and internal), MWB. 240; evacuation of excrement, MW. — **kalpa**, m. mode of purification, purificatory rite, ib. — **kūpa**, m. 'excretion-pit,' a privy, ib. — **tas**, n. by way of purification, Āpast.

— **tva**, n. purity, Hit. (v. l.) — **vat**, mfn. clean, pure (lit. and fig.), Yājñ.; MBh. — **vidhi**, m. rule of purification (after defilement by the death of a relation), W. — **sampgraha-vivṛiti**, f. N. of wk.

**Saucācamana-vidhi**, m. N. of wk. **Saucācāra**, m. purificatory rite, mode of cleansing the person by ablation &c. (after voiding excrement or contracting any defilement), W.; — *paddhati*, f. N. of wk. **Śau-cēpsu**, mfn. wishing or intending to obtain purification, MW.

**Saucaka**, mfn. pure (in *a-s<sup>o</sup>*), Hcat.; n. purity (in *a-s<sup>o</sup>*), MBh.

**Saucakiya**, n. N. of wk., Hcat.

**Saucika**, m. a cleaner, cleanser, MW.; a partic. mixed caste (the son of a Śauṅdika and a Kaivarta woman), ib.

**Saucikarnika**, mfn. (fr. *śuci-karṇa*), g. *ku-mudāddi*.

**Saucin**, mfn. pure (in *a-s<sup>o</sup>*), Kull. on Mn. v, 84.

**Saucivrikshi**, m. patr. fr. *śuci-vriksha*, Ni-dānas. (pl. *śukhās*, ib.; f. *śukhī* or *śukhyā*, Pāṇ. iv, 1, 81).

**Souceya**, m. a washerman, L.; (*yā*
