

Sarvad.; belonging to the present time, present (not past or future), comp.; (*am*), ind. fitly, properly, MBh.; presently, now, ib. &c. &c. — **काला**, m. the present time, Sāmkhyak. **Sāmpratādhipa**, m. a present or reigning sovereign, MārkP.

Sāmpratika, mf(ī)n. suitable, fit, proper, Uttarar.; present (not future), Kull.

साम्प्रदानिक *sāmpradānika*, mfn. (fr. *sam-pradāna*), g. *vinayāddi*.

Sāmpradāyika, mfn. (fr. *sam-pradāya*) based on tradition, traditional (cf. *a-s^o*), Baudh.; Jaim.; standing upon or following tradition, RāmatUp.

साम्प्रयोगिक *sāprayogika*, mfn. (fr. *sam-prayoga*) relating to use or application, Cat. **Sām-prayogikādhikarana**, n. N. of a Kāma-śāstra.

साम्प्रश्विक *sāpraśnika*, mfn. (fr. *sam-praśna*), g. *cheddādi*.

साम्प्रयक *sāmpriyaka*, mfn. (fr. *sam-priya*) inhabited by people who are dear to one another, g. *rājanyāddi*.

साम्ब *sāmb*, v.l. for *samb*, q.v., p. 1177.

साम्ब I. *sāmba*, m. (also written *śāmba*) N. of a son of Kṛishṇa and Jāmbavatī (in consequence of the curse of some holy sages who had been deceived by a female disguise which he had assumed, he was condemned to produce offspring in the shape of a terrific iron club for the destruction of the race of Viṣṇu and Andhaka; he is said to have been instructed by Nārada in the worship of the sun, and by Vyāsa in the ritual of the Magi), MBh.; Hariv.; Pur.; (also with *śāstrin*) N. of various authors and teachers, Cat.; n. = *purāṇa*, ib. — **carita**, n. N. of wk. — **pañcasikā**, f. N. of a hymn by Sāmba (also called *surya-stotra*). — **pura**, n. or **-puri**, f. N. of a city founded by Sāmba (said to be situated on the banks of the Candra-bhāga), Cat. — **purāṇa**, n. = *sāmbopapurāṇa*. — **pradyumna-prabandha**, m., **-muktāvali-stotra**, n. N. of wks. — **mūrti**, mfn. having the form of Sāmba, Cat. — **vati**, f. N. of a courfezan, Rājat. — **vijaya**, m. N. of wk. **Sāmbāditya**, m. a partic. form of the sun, Cat. **Sāmbēśvara**, m. N. of a temple founded by Sāmbavatī, Rājat. **Sāmbōpapurāṇa**, n. N. of an Upapurāṇa. **Sāmbi**, m. patr. fr. *sāmba*, g. *bāhvādi*.

साम्ब 2. *sāmba*, mfn. attended by Ambā (q.v.), Kāsikh. — **śiva**, m. N. of an author, Cat.

साम्बन्धिक *sāmbandhika*, n. (fr. *sam-bandha*) relationship by marriage, MBh.; conversation such as is fit for people related by marriage, ib.

साम्बर *sāmbara*, ^o*rī*. See *sāmb^o*, p. 1065.

साम्बर्य *sāmbarya*, m. (prob. w.r. for *sām-varya*) a patr., Samskārak.

साम्बाधिक *sāmbādhika*, m. (fr. *sam-bādhā*) the second Yāma (q.v.) of a night, L.

साम्बुवासर *sāmbu-vāsara*, mfn. (of doubtful meaning), Kathās. lxx, 59.

साम्भरा *sāmbhara*, n. (fr. *sam-bhara*) a kind of salt, L.

साम्भल *sāmbhala*, mfn. bred in Sam-bhala (as a horse), L.

साम्भवी *sāmbhavī*, f. (fr. *sam-bhava*) possibility, probability, L.; the red Lodhra tree, W.

साम्भस *sāmbhas*, mfn. having or containing water, watery, Bhaṭṭ.

साम्भाष्य *sāmbhāshya*, n. (fr. *sam-bhāshin*) conversation, g. *brāhmaṇāddi*.

साम्भूयि *sāmbhūyi*, m. patr. fr. *sam-bhūyas*, g. *bāhvādi*.

साम्भत्य *sāmmatya*, n. (fr. *sam-mati*) consent, agreement, g. *dṛiḍhāddi*.

साम्मद *sāmmadā*, m. (fr. *sam-mada*) patr. of Matsya (king of the aquatic animals), ŠBr.; ĀśvSr.; of the author of RV. viii, 67, Anukr.

साम्मनस्य *sāmmanasyā*, n. (fr. *sam-manas*) concord, harmony, AV.; (*āni*), n. pl. charms to secure harmony, AV., SBE. xlvi, 134.

साम्मातुर *sāmmātura* and *sāmmātra*, m. patr. fr. *sam-mātri*, Pat. on Pāṇ. iv, 1, 115.

साम्मार्जिन *sāmmārjina*, n. (fr. *sam-mārjin*), Pāṇ. v, 4, 15, Sch.

साम्मितिकायनि *sāmmitikāyani*, m. a patr., Pat.

साम्मुखी *sāmmukhī*, f. (fr. *sam-mukha*) a Ti-thi or lunar day extending till evening (see *tithi*), L.

साम्मुख्या, n. the state of being present face to face or in front (^o*khyam ā-√dhā*, Ā., with gen. = 'to go to'), Sāh.; favour, fondness for (opp. to *vai-mukhya*), Rājat.; care for, attention to (comp.), ib.

साम्मेघ्य *sāmmeghyā*, n. (fr. *sam-megha*) the cloudy season, TS.

साम्मोदनिक *sāmmodenika*, mfn. = *sammodanāya prabhavati*, g. *sāmtāpāddi*.

साम्य *sāmya*, n. (fr. 2. *sama*) equality, evenness, equilibrium, equipoise, equal or normal state (acc. with *√nī*, 'to bring to that st.', 'calm'), MBh.; Kāv. &c.; likeness, sameness, identity with (instr. with and without *saha*, or gen., or loc., or comp.), MuṇḍUp.; MBh. &c.; equality of rank or position, Mn.; Yājñ.; VarBṛS.; homogeneousness (of sounds), Vop.; measure, time, MBh.; equability towards (loc. or *prati*), impartiality, indifference, Bhag.; Kum.; BhP.; justice (*sāmyam √kṛi*, 'to act justly towards [loc.]'), MBh.; v.l. for *śalyā*, Kāvya. i, 39.

— **grāha**, m. one who beats time, R. — **tā**, f., -tva, n. equality, sameness, Mn.; MBh. &c. — **tāla-viśārada**, mfn. versed in time and measure, MBh. ii, 131 (B.). — **bodhaka**, mfn. expressive of similarity, MW. **Sāmyāvasthā**, f. a state of equipoise (of the 3 constituent ingredients of Prakṛiti; see *guṇa*), Sarvad.; Sāmkhyak.: RTL. 32. **Sāmyāvasthāna**, n. id., Śāmk.

साम्यक्ष *sāmyaksha*, *sāmyeksha* and ^o*kshya*, (prob.) w.r. for *sāmakshya*.

साम्राज्य *sāmrājya*, n. (fr. *sam-rāj*) complete or universal sovereignty, empire, dominion over (gen., loc., or comp.), RV. &c. &c.; mfn. relating to sovereignty, TS.; (^o*jyā*, m.) a universal sovereign, RV. viii, 25, 17 (accord. to g. *kurv-ādi*, 'the son of a un^os^o''). — **kṛit**, mfn. one who exercises imperial sway, MW. — **dīkshita**, mfn. consecrated to universal empire, ib. — **lakshmi-pīṭhikā**, f., -lakshmi-pūjā, f., -siddhi, f. N. of wks. — **siddhidā**, f. N. of the family deity of the Uddalakas, Cat.

साम्राणिकर्दम *sāmrāṇi-kardama*, n. a perfume or mixture of fragrant substances, civet, L.

साम्राणि-जा, n. a kind of fruit-tree, L.

साय I. *sāyā*, n. (prob. fr. *√so*, see *avasāya*, *avasāna*; but cf. 2. *sāya*, col. 3) the close of day, evening (*sāyam √kṛi*, 'to spend the evening, make a stay'), RV. &c. &c.; Evening personified (as a son of Pushpārṇa and Doshā or as a son of Dhātri and Kuhū), BhP.; (*āmī*), ind. in the evening, at eventide (*sāyam sāyam*, 'every evening'; see also below), RV. &c. &c. [Cf. accord. to some, Lat. *sērus*.] — **tare**, ind. late in the evening, Pat. on Pāṇ. iv, 3, 23, Vārtt. I. — **dhūrta**, m. a rogue, cheat or deceiver in the form of ev^o, Naish. — **mandana**, n. 'ev^o-ornament,' sunset, W. **Sāyārambha**, mfn. beginning in the ev^o, Kātyār., Sch. **Sāyāśana**, n. an ev^o-meal, ib. **Sāyāhan**, n. or ^o*hna*, m. eventide, TBr.; Mn.; MBh. &c.; (^o*hna*)-*samaye*, ind. at eventide, R. **Sāyōdbhidura**, mfn. expanding or blossoming in the evening, L.

Sāyam, in comp. for *sāyam*, col. 3. — **yāvan**, mfn. going or coming in the evening, TBr. — **sam-dhyā**, f. the evening twilight, RTL. 407; — **devatā**, f. 'deity of the ev^o t^o', N. of Sarasvatī, L.; -*prayoga*, m. N. of wk. — **sūrya**, m. the ev^o sun, MBh.; *yōḍha*, mfn. brought by the ev^o sun (said of a guest), Mn. iii, 105. — **homa**, m. the ev^o oblation, ĀśvSr., Sch. — **kāla**, m. eventide, evening, Naish., Sch. — **kālika** (Vās., Sch.) or **kālinā** (Ragh., Sch.), mfn. belonging to evening, vespertine. — **gṛīha**, mfn. = *yatra-s^o*, Prab. — **goshtī**, mfn. brought into the fold at ev^o, AitBr. — **tūrya**, n. drumming at ev^o, L. — **dugdhā**, mfn. milked in the evening, ib.; ŠBr. — **dohā**, m. milking the cows at evening, ev^o milking or milk, ĀpSr.; -*vat*, ind., ib. — **dhṛiti**, f. = *homa*, MW. — **nivāsa**, m. ev^o abode or resting-place, ib.

Sāyantana, mf(ī)n. relating to evening, vespertine, Kāv.; Pañcat.; SāṅgS. — **mallikā**, f. evening-jasmine, Ragh. — **samaya**, m. eventide, Pañcat.

Sāyam, ind. in comp. — **adhivāsa**, m. 'evening-decoration,' decorating an image of Durgā on the fifth day of the month Āśvina, MW. — **āśanā**, n. an ev^o meal, MaitrS. — **āśa**, m. id., Kauś.; -*prātarāśa* (only loc. e), the ev^o and morning m^o, Gobh. — **āhuti**, f. an ev^o oblation, ŠBr.; GiŚrS. — **upāsana-vidhi**, m., -*upāsana-prayoga*, m. N. of wks. — **posha**, m. food taken in the ev^o, ŚāṅkhBr. — **prātar** (*sāyām-*), ind. in the ev^o and m^o (also *sāyam prātaśca*), AV. &c. &c.; -*agnihotra-prayoga*, m., -*agnihotra-homa*, m. N. of wks.; -*āśin*, mfn. eating (only) in the ev^o and m^o, ŠBr.; -*āhuti*, f. du. ev^o and m^o oblation, Kātyār.; -*upāsana-vidhi*, m. N. of wk.; -*doha*, m. ev^o and m^o milking, ib.; -*maya*, mf(ī)n. consisting of ev^o and m^o, Kāsikh.; -*homa*, m. du. ev^o and m^o oblation, Gobh. (also N. of wk.) — **bhava**, m. becoming evening, growing dark, AV. — **bhojanā**, n. an evening meal, Kull. on Mn. iii, 105. — **mantra**, m. a Mantra to be used in the evening, Baudh.

Sāyamprātika, mfn. (fr. *sāyam-prātar*) belonging to evening and morning, Pāṇ. vi, 4, 144, Vārtt. 5, Pat.

साय 2. *sāya*, m. (fr. *√2. si*; for 1. see col. 2) a missile, arrow (= *sāyaka*), L.; (*sāyā*), n. unloosing, unyoking, turning in, RV. &c.

Sāyaka, mfn. intended or fitted to be discharged or hurled, RV. (Naigh. ii, 20); m. (in RV. also n.) a missile, arrow, RV. &c. &c.; m. a symbolical expression for the number 'five' (from the 5 arrows of the god of love), Sāh.; a sword, MBh.; R.; the latitude of the sky, Ganit.; Saccharum Sara, L.; N. of a man, Pravar.; (*ikā*), f. a dagger, L.; the being or standing in regular order (= *krama-sthiti*; prob. w.r. for *sāyikā*), L. — **puṇkha**, m. the feathered part of an arrow, Ragh.; (*ā*), f. a partic. plant (= *śāra-puṇkha*), L. — **pranutta** (*sāy*^o), mfn. driven away or put to flight by arrows, AV. — **maya**, mf(ī)n. consisting of arrows, MBh.; Hariv.

Sāyakāya, Nom. Ā. ^o*yate*, to resemble arrows, represent the arrows of (comp.), Daś.

Sāyakāyanā, m. patr. fr. *sāyaka*, ŠBr. (g. *naḍāddi*).

Sāyakāyanin, m. pl. the school of Sāyakāyanā, ib.

सायणा *sāyāṇa*, m. (said to be a Drāvida word) N. of a learned Brāhmaṇa (also called Sāyāṇā-mādhava and Sāyāṇācārya; he was son of Māyāṇa, pupil of Viṣṇu Sarva-jñā and of Saṃkarāṇanda; and flourished under Bukka I of Vijaya-nagara or Vidyā-nagara [A.D. 1350-1379] and his successor Hari-hara, and died in 1387; of more than a hundred works attributed to him, among which are commentaries on nearly all parts of the Veda, some were carried out by his pupils, and some were written in conjunction with his brother Mādhavācārya or Vidyāraṇya-svāmin). — **mādhaviya**, mfn. written or composed by Sāyāṇā-mādhava, Sarvad.

Sāyāṇiya, mfn. relating to or composed by Sāyāṇa; n. a work of Sāyāṇa, Cat.

सायतन *sāyatana*, mfn. together with the place of abode &c., TS.

सायन *sāyana*, mfn. proceeding in the way of an Ayana (q.v.), Śāṅkhār.; connected with the word *ayana*, ib.; n. (in astron.) with the precession or the longitude of a planet reckoned from the vernal equinoctial point, W.

सायवस *sāyavasa*, m. a patr., ŠBr.

सायास *sāyāsa*, mfn. beset with difficulties or trouble, Kathās.

सायिन् *sāyin*, m. (prob. w.r. for *sādin*) a horse
