सार्पे sārpa, mfn. (fr. *sarpa*, of which it is also the Vṛiddhi form in comp.) relating to snakes or serpents; n. (with or scil. *bha*) N. of the Nakshatra Āślesha, VarBrS.; R. &c. — **rāja**, m. N. of various Sāmans, ĀrshBr. — **rājñā**, mf(*i*n). belonging to or coming from Sarpa-rājñī (the serpent-queen), ŚrS.; (*i*), f. N. of the authoress of RV. x, 189, ŚāṅkhBr.; pl. the verses attributed to Sarpa-rājñī, ŚrS. — **vidyika**, mfn. (fr. *sarpa-vidyā*) versed in ophiology or snake-science, Pat.

सार्पिषं sārpisha, mfn. (fr. *sarpis*) containing clarified butter, cooked with ghee, L.

सार्यं sārya. See p. 1208, col. 1.

सार्वं sārva, mfn. (fr. *sarva*, of which it is also the Vṛiddhi form in comp.) relating to all, fit or good for all, Śiś. xiv, 4 (cf. Pāṇ. v, 1, 10); general, universal (see comp.); m. a Buddha or a Jina, L. — **m.-saha**, m. (fr. *śarvam-s^o*) a kind of salt, L. — **karmika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-karman*) fit for all actions (cf. -*karmika* below), L. — **kāma**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-kāma*) designed for one who wishes for all things, ĀpSr.; -*samriddha*, m. the sixth day in the Karma-māsa (prob. w.r. for *sarva-k^o*), IndSt. — **kāmika**, mf(*i*n). (fr. id.) fulfilling all desires, gratifying every wish, GīŚrS.; MBh. &c. — **kāmya**, n. (fr. id.) fulfilment of every desire, Jaim. — **kārmika**, mfn. (cf. -*karmika* above) all-effective as a remedy against (gen.), Car. — **kāla**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-k^o*) taking place at all times or seasons (as marriage), ĀśvGr. — **kālika**, mfn. (fr. id.) belonging to all times, suited to all seasons, everlasting, Āpast.; MBh. &c. — **kālya**, n. (fr. id.) occurrence at all times, Gaṇar. — **keṣya**, mfn. coming or derived from Sarvakeṣa, g. *śāndikāddi*. — **kratuka**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-kratu*) relating to all sacrifices, Lāty., Sch. — **gāṇa**, n. (v.l. *sarva-g^o*) salty soil, L. — **gāmin**, mfn. perhaps w.r. for *sarva-g^o* entering into the Universal Soul, Āpast. — **gunika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-guna*) endowed with every good quality or excellence, MBh.; Hariv. — **carmīna**, mfn. (= *sarva-c^o*) wholly made of leather, Pāṇ. v, 2, 5. — **janika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-jana*) relating or belonging or suited to all men, universal, public, Pāṇ. v, 1, 9, Vārtt. 5, Pat. — **janīna**, mfn. (fr. id.) = prec., ib.; = *sarva-jane sādhuh*, g. *pratijanāddi*. — **janya**, mfn. (fr. id.) general, universal, VarBrS. — **jñā**, mf(*i*n). (fr. *sarva-jñā*) coming from or relating to one who is omniscient, HPariś.; n., w.r. for next. — **jñya**, n. omniscience, Sarvad. — **dhātu**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-dhātu*) applicable to the whole of a radical term or to the complete form of the verbal base (after the conjugational characteristics or Vikaraṇas are affixed in the four conj. or special tenses; in Veda often confounded with the Ārdhadhātukas, q.v.); n. N. of the verbal terminations of the four conj. tenses (Pr., Impf., Pot., and Impv.), and of all the root affixes (such as *sānac* and *sātrī*) which have an indicatory *s*, Pāṇ. i, 2, 4; iii, 4, 113 &c. — **nāmika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-nāman*) relating to a pronoun or pronominal, Kāt. — **nāmnyā**, n. (fr. id.) the being a name for everything, Nir. vii, 4. — **bhatta-bhaumācārya**, m. N. of an author (prob. = *sārva-bhauma-bhāṭṭācārya*), Cat. — **bhautika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-bhūta*) relating to all elements or beings, comprising all animated beings, Mn. xii, 51. — **bhaumā**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-bhūmi*) relating to or consisting of or ruling over the whole

earth, comprising the whole world, known throughout the world, ŚBr. &c. &c.; relating to all conditions of the mind, Yogas., Sch.; m. an emperor, universal monarch, AitBr. &c. &c.; N. of a son of Aham-yāti, MBh.; of a son of Su-dharman, Hariv.; of a son of Vidūratha, Pur.; of various authors (also with *bhāṭṭācārya* and *miśra*), Cat.; of the elephant of Kubera (regent of the north), R.; Vās.; (*am*), n. sovereignty over the whole earth, universal empire, BhP.; -*grīha*, n. an imperial palace, L.; -*bhavana*, n. id., Śāntiś.; -*vrata*, n. a partic. religious observance, Cat.; -*sarvasve rāma-sūkta*, n., -*siddhānta*, m. (fr. *sarva-loka*) prevailing throughout or common to the whole world, known by or permitted to every one, common, universal, MBh.; Kāv. &c. — **varṇika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-varṇa*) of every kind or sort, Mn.; VarBrS.; relating to every caste or tribe, Gaut.; MBh. — **varṇika**, mfn. composed or written by Sarva-varman, Cat. — **vidya**, n. (fr. *sarva-vidyā*) omniscience, g. *catur-varṇāddi*. — **vibhaktika**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-vibhakti*) applicable or belonging to all the cases of a noun &c., R., Sch. — **vedasa**, mfn. (= and v.l. for *sarva-v^o*) one who gives away all his wealth at a sacred rite, Mn. xi, 1; (*am*), n. a person's entire property; -*dakshīṇa*, mfn. (a sacrifice) at which one's whole property is given away as a fee to Brāhmans, Yājñ. — **vedya**, n. (fr. *sarva-veda*) all the Vedas collectively, g. *brāhmaṇḍi*; m. a Brāhmaṇa conversant with all the Vedas, W. — **vaidika**, mfn. (fr. id.) versed in all the Vedas, Kauś. — **samsarga-lavanya**, n. (v.l. *sarva-s^o*), salty soil, L. — **saha**, v.l. for *sārvam-s^o*, q.v. — **surabhi**, mfn. (= or fr. *sarva-s^o*) fragrant with all odours, ĀpGr. — **sūtra**, mfn. (fr. *sarva-s^o*) consisting of threads of all colours, ĀpSr. — **sena**, m. (fr. *sarva-s^o*) a partic. Pañca-rātra, ĀśvŚr.; (*i*), f. patr. of Su-nandā (the wife of Bhāratā), MBh.; -*yajñā*, (prob.) w.r. for *sarva-senī-yajña*, Vait. — **senī**, m. (fr. id.) patr. of Śauceya, TŚ.; pl. N. of a warrior tribe, g. *dāmanyāddi*; -*yajña*, m. a partic. sacrifice, ĀpSr., Sch. — **senīya**, m. a king of the Sārvasenīs, g. *dāmanyāddi*. — **senīya**, mfn. coming or derived from Sarva-sena, g. *śāṇḍikāddi*. — **Sārvātmya**, n. सार्वपं sārshapa, mf(*i*n). (fr. *sarshapa*) made of or derived from mustard, Kauś.; n. (with or scil. *taila*) mustard oil, Suśr.

सार्वष्टि sārṣṭha, mfn. (perhaps fr. 7. *sa* + *ā* + *rishi*, √2. *rishi*) of equal rank or condition, ĀśvŚr.

Sārṣṭhi, mfn. (prob. connected with *ārsha* and *rishi* and *rishva*; cf. *rishi*) = prec., Pravar.; m. pl. N. of a Gotra, ĀśvŚr.; = next, BhP. — **tā**, f. equality in rank or condition or power (sometimes regarded as one of the grades of Mukti or beatitude; cf. *sālokya*, col. 3), TBr.; Up. &c.

Sārṣṭhya, n. a partic. state of Mukti (see above).

साल 1. sāla, m. (often incorrectly written for 1. *sāla*) the Śāl tree; a wall, fence &c.; for these and other meanings and compounds such as *sālāgrāma* &c., see 1. *sāla*; (*ā*), f., see next.

Sālā, f. (generally written *sālā*) a house (see *nīh-sālā*). — **karī**, f. a female captive won in battle, W.

— **vṛikā**, m. (in later language mostly *sālā-vṛikā*) 'house-wolf(?)', a kind of wolf or hyena or jackal or similar animal, RV. &c. &c. — **vṛikīya**, w.r. for next. — **vṛikīya**, m. the young of a wolf or hyena &c., MaitrS.; PañcavBr.; KaushUp.

साल 2. sāla, m. N. of a king, Rājat. — **candra**, m. N. of a prince, Buddh. — **Sālēndra-rāja**, m. N. of a man, Lalit.

सालक sālaka, mfn. adorned with locks (of hair), Kāvyād.

सालकि sālaki, m. N. of a Muni, Cat.

सावक 1. sāvaka.

सालक्तक sālaktaka, mfn. dyed with lac, Kathās.

सालक्षण्य sālakṣaṇya, n. (fr. *sa-lakṣaṇa*) sameness of characteristics or attributes, Sarvad.

सालग sālaga, m. (in music) a partic. Rāga, Saṅgīt. — **sūḍaka**, m. pl. N. of partic. measures, ib. — **sūda-nṛitya**, n. a kind of dance, ib.

सालग्राम sālā-grāma, *sālāṅka* &c. See *sāl*, p. 1067, cols. 1 and 3.

सालंकार sālāṅkāra, mf(*ā*)n. having ornaments or decorations, decorated, adorned, Śrutab.

सालन sālana. See *sālana*, p. 1067, col. 2.

सालनिर्यास sālā-niryāsa, *sālā-pattrā* &c. See *sāl*, p. 1067, col. 2.

सालबल sālābala(?), N. of a place, Buddh.

सालम्ब sālāmba, mfn. having anything as a support (comp.), Kathās.

सालम्बना, mfn. belonging to or connected with a partic. mental exercise (see *āl*).

सालवन sālā-vana. See *bhadra-s^o*.

सालवाहन sālāvāhana or *sālivāhana*, v.l. for *sātav^o* and *sālav^o*, Singhās.

सालस sālāsa, mfn. having languor, languid, tired, indolent, lazy, Ritus.

साला sālā, f. See 1. *sāla*, col. 2.

सालतुरीय sālāturiya. See *sāl*, p. 1067.

सालिका sālikā, f. a flute, L.

sāleyikā or **sāleyī**, f. id., L.

सालिङ्ग्य sāliṅga, n. (fr. *sa-liṅga*) same ness of characteristics, ĀpSr., Sch.

सालिमञ्जरि sāli-mañjari. See *sāl*, p. 1068.

सालिवाहन sālāvāhana. See *sālav^o* above.

सालूर sālūra, *sāleya*. See *sāl*, p. 1068.

सालोक्य sālokya, n. (fr. *sa-loka*) the being in the same sphere or world, residence in the same heaven with (instr. with *saha*, or gen., or comp.; this is one of the four stages of beatitude), MBh.; Hariv.; Pur. &c. — **tā**, f. id., MBh. — **Sālokyādi-catushtaya**, n. the four (stages of beatitude), viz. Sālokya &c. (the others beings *sāmīpya*, *sārūpya*, and *sāyujya*; see also *sārṣṭhi*), RTL. 41.

सालोप sālopa, mfn. (? for *sa-l^o* or = *sāl^o*) having a bit or morsel (said of the mouth), Buddh.

सालोहित sālohitā, m. (= *sa-l^o*) a person related by blood, kinsman, Divyāv.

साल्वा sālva, *sālvana* &c. See *sālva*, p. 1068.

साल्हा sālha, m. N. of a man, Buddh.

साल्हणा sālhaṇa, mfn. belonging or peculiar to Sālhaṇi (see next), Rājat.

Sālhaṇi, m. patr. fr. *salhaṇa*, ib.

साल्ही sālhi. See p. 1193, col. 2.

सावा sāvā, m. (fr. √3. *su*) a Soma libation (cf. *prātah-* and *sahasra-s^o*), RV.

सावना, mfn. (fr. 1. *savana*, p. 1190) relating to or determining the three daily Soma libations, i.e. corresponding to the solar time (day, month, year), VarBrS., Sch.; m. an institutor of a sacrifice or employer of priests at a sacrifice (= *yajamāna*), L.; the conclusion of a sac^o or the ceremonies by which it is terminated, L.; N. of Varuṇa, L.; n. scil. (*māna*) the correct solar time, Niḍānas.
