

Āyu (I)—a son of Prāṇa and Urjasvati; a Vasu;¹ Father of Vaitāṇya and others.²

Āyu (II)—the son of Puruhotra, and father of Sātvata.

Āyu (III)—one of the six sons of Purūravas and Urvaśī; wife Prabhā, Rāhu's daughter; father of five sons, Nahuṣa, Vṛddhaśarman, Rāju, Dambha, and Vipāpman, all of them expert warriors.
